NZQA Entries

Students are urged to log on to the NZQA web site to check their entries and results. If there are any discrepancies, they should see Mr Delgrosso, Dean of Administrative Services URGENTLY. Log in at www.nzqa.govt.nz/login

The College is not able to deal with NZQA queries regarding missing credits until late January 2013.

NZQA External Exams

Should students be unable to sit their external exams they need to apply for a derived grade (the work done during the year provides evidence of the level of achievement). All derived grade requests must be in writing using the official form from NZQA, which is available from Mr Black, Deputy Principal. The completed forms must be handed in to Mr Black by **4 December** and must include supporting documents such as a medical certificate.

The 2012 results are published in early 2013. Results will only be available online through the student login. Students should ensure they have login details before the end of school in 2012 as the school is closed in January. Students can order a printed Result Notice from their Learner login by the end of 2012. Scholarship Result Notices will be sent to all students in February.

Year 9 and 10 Programme - Caring for our Community (C4C), Tuesday 4 and Wednesday 5 December

At the end of each year Lynfield College runs a cross-curricular programme for our junior students. This is scheduled to take place after feedback on the exams has been returned to the students. The theme is 'Caring for our Community' with both Year 9 and Year 10 students being involved.

The aim of the 'Caring for our Community' programme is to encourage the students to be actively involved in the community in which they live. This is a good opportunity to encourage them to look at the world from another point of view and to look beyond themselves. Doing something for someone else is a way of achieving this. This supports many of the principles, values and key competencies of the New Zealand curriculum including community engagement, integrity, participating and contributing and relating to others.

The normal school timetable will not run on these days as ALL students and ALL teaching staff will be involved in the workshops. Approximately 30 different workshops will be offered to the students. Details of these will be available on e-LynC. Click on the C4C picture on the homepage. Registrations will also be made via e-LynC. These will open at lunchtime on Monday 19 November. Open Water swimmer, **Natalie Woodgate (Y12)** won the women's Orca Cup (1st female) at the Herne Bay swim last weekend. She also won the Wai-Wai Shield which is a handicap event for club swimmers (including swim clubs and surf clubs). Again, Natalie came out best for the women. Both these trophies are only able to be won by swimmers who aren't wearing wetsuits, as it is a historic swim, and wetsuits weren't around when it started! Usually wetsuits give
