We are almost half way through Term 1 with teaching staff having undertaken assessment activities with all students. 

Summer sports are well under way. We currently have teams in interschool competitions as follows:

Of particular note is our 1st XI Cricket team who have had some very competitive games, usually coming out on top! In a recent game they scored 214-1 from 29 overs with an exceptional innings from Darshan Mehta scoring 109 not out! Scoring over 100 runs in school cricket is a very rare event. The other opening batsman was Saharsh Dhankawade who scored 47 not out.

Lynfield then bowled Liston College out for 194 from 26.5 overs – a win by 20 runs. Our star bowlers were Rugved Deshpande (2 for 16 from 5 overs) and Akshay Chauhan (3 for 8 from 2.5 overs). A Lynfield College win by 20 runs!

Individual Honours

As this goes to print, 2 of our top swimmers, **Kieran Sumner** (Y12) and **Matt Roach** (Y12) are competing in the New Zealand Age Group Swim Champs in Wellington. The next newsletter will have an up-date on their successes.

Michael Carswell (Y10) won gold at the Auckland Age-Group Track Cycling Championship in the weekend. This medal will join the gold medals he won for the Individual Pursuit and 500m Time Trial. He also placed 4th in the Points race and 6th in the Scratch race. Michael has also been selected to represent Auckland at the Nationals in Invercargill.

Sheé Nathan-Wong (Y12) has been selected as a member, and named as captain, of the Auckland U17 Girls Touch team. She has also been selected as a member of the Auckland U19 Girls Touch team and the NZ Maori U16 Girls Touch team which travels to the Gold Coast in October.

During the holidays **Danielle Bradley** (Y13) went with a team from Auckland Futsal to Australia and competed in the Australian Futsal National Championships. Her team went through the tournament undefeated against Australian state rep teams and are now the current Australian Futsal National 16 grade girls Champions. This is the first time this tournament has been won by a NZ team!
