Dear Parents/Caregivers

Thank you to the many parents and caregivers who attended the student progress conferences held during weeks 3 and 4. Over 3,000 interview bookings were made over the two evenings, which ensured that valuable feedback on students' progress was gained by parents and teaching staff. Over the next two weeks senior students should follow through on any advice and revision guidelines recommended by their teachers to ensure success in the senior exams which begin in week 7 of this term.

Many parents and students also took this opportunity to gain further information and advice on course selection for 2014. All Year 10 – 12 students have now been issued with the 2014 Senior Course Information booklet. Students who were absent at the time these booklets were distributed should see their form teachers. Please take time to discuss option choices and career paths with your children. It is essential that pages 2 – 7 of this booklet are read very carefully, particularly the course prerequisite and University Entry requirements, before making course selection decisions. Within these introductory pages are listed the school staff who are able to assist you in making these important decisions. A file copy of the Senior Course Information booklet can be opened from the front page of e-LynC or from our website.

Students are required to hand their completed course selection forms to their Form Teachers by **Friday 30 August**. This year parents are encouraged to enter their child's selections on the Parent Portal. If you have been unable to do this, please indicate that on the form. As the Parent Portal is so new, we will be using the two systems simultaneously this year, with the backup of a paper copy.

Students are invited to nominate themselves or another student to be the Student Representative on the Board of Trustees for 2013 – 2014. The role of the student representative is to provide input to the BOT, based on the perspectives of the students they represent. BYOD Information Evening - Year 10 2014

In 2014 Lynfield College is going to be implementing a programme in which students will bring their own device to school in support of their learning. This programme will involve all Year 10 students in 2014. The aim of the programme is to enhance student learning through the integration of technology into the classroom. BYOD will enable teachers to work in new innovative ways that will be more interactive and engaging for students. It will also challenge students to collaborate with one another and extend their learning beyond the classroom walls.

Lynfield College has been resourced to meet the changes that are happening in our society with its upgrade of the network, including Ultra-fast Broadband, installation of a Wi-Fi network throughout the school, introduction of Google Apps and development of its online learning environment, e-LynC.

Student and Parent portals also provide timely information for parents and students. A Lynfield College App for both Android and Apple has been developed and will be introduced by the end of the year. BYOD is the next step in the journey.

Year 9 and 10 Health Programme

Year 9 and 10 Health students are soon to be starting a Sexuality unit. I would like to inform parents of the topics we will be focusing on and to invite parents to discuss these with us. Parents are encouraged to suggest further topics that they feel are important for their students to explore.

Year 9 - Main Objectives

Students will identify the characteristics of positive relationships and explore relationships in their own lives.

- To identify the physical and emotional changes of puberty.
- To encourage greater acceptance of their own body, by helping students to become aware of the negative influence
 of the media.

Year 10 - Main Objectives

Students will identify the characteristics of positive friendships and relationships.

Students will explore and learn to recognise assertive behaviours in themselves and others and how this can enhance relationships.

- To identify appropriate methods of contraception and how to use them, with an emphasis on abstinence.
- To identify appropriate protection against sexually transmissible infections.
- To identify services available to teenagers at Lynfield College and in the wider Auckland area.

Students will learn the dangers of 'sexting' and using internet chat rooms.

Students will explore the pressures that they face from peers and from the media regarding sexuality.

Individual Honours

Our students are involved in a very wide variety of sports at regional, provincial or national level. Congratulations to:

Nataly See (Y12) has been selected to represent New Zealand at the 8th World Taekwondo Poomsae Championships to be held in Bali, Indonesia in the first week of November.

Bianca Leilua (Y12) has been selected to represent Samoa in sailing in the 9th Pacific Mini Games to take place 2 – 12 September. This sporting event, held every 4 years, involves 22 countries competing in 104 events over 8 sports. This year they are being hosted by Wallis and Futuna, a French territory in the middle of the South Pacific. Bianca will be sailing a Laser Radial in 12 races during the 10 days of the games. She has been regularly out on the water in Auckland's winter weather as she works through her tough training regime for these games. We wish her well and look forward to hearing results when she returns.

Ashleigh Pinner (Y9) was placed 3rd overall in Level 5 at the NZSS Gymsports Artistic championships.

Darius Mafoe (Y13) plays 2nd row, prop or loose forward for Richmond Rovers U17 Rugby League team which played in the Grand Final against Otahuhu recently. Talent scouts from the Gold Coast Titans NRL Club were watching that game and were so impressed with Darius' performance that they offered him a 2 year contract! He will begin pre-season training with the Titans Development Squad in January. If he does well in 2014 he will then be considered for the "20s" and the Toyota Cup competition.

Patrick Whitford (Y13) has also impressed Australian Rugby League selectors. This time it is the Sydney Roosters who have seen and spoken to Patrick as a result of his performance for his Waitemata Rugby League Club where he plays as hooker or loose forward. They have offered him the opportunity to attend pre-season training in January with the possibility of being selected to play for the Roosters feeder club.

Grace Kukutai (Y13) has recently been named as the MVP for the Netball Waitakere U17 Rep team. She was also awarded the "Netball Waitakere Senior Player of the Year" trophy – an exceptional achievement for a player still at school.

Sports Scene

Team Talk

With only one week of winter competition this year it is time to reflect on the season for the various sports. Over the next two newsletters we will cover all codes.

Basketball

This year we have had 7 Lynfield teams competing weekly - the most we have ever had! Our premier boys had a tough year in the top schools' competition in NZ. Although no teams made the finals, our teams improved enormously, achieving very good results in a year where the focus has largely been on re-building basketball at all levels. The top achieving teams were the U17 Girls and the U 15 Boys B (development) who both lost by only 1 point in very close and hard fought semi-finals. The U15A and U17 Boys both had strong teams with potential but could not quite make finals. Both these teams finished in 5th place but are well placed for next year. The U19 and U15 Girls were made up of largely novice players. They gained valuable experience throughout the season and we look forward to seeing the younger players develop their skills next year. Next year we intend to include a U17 development team. We are planning to get coaches in place early later this year or at the very beginning of 2014. This will allow us to start the year with a structured pre-season basketball programme meaning they will get the best possible start to the competition season.

Hockey - Girls 1st X1

It was a very challenging season for the Girls 1st X1 Hockey team as they were placed in a grade higher than we had entered. However, the team rose to the challenge and were very competitive, winning some hard fought games. Kate Hughes did a magnificent job taking on a coaching role. The team was comprised of several new young players who worked hard to develop and improve their individual skills. Maddy Poland was consistently outstanding in defence as was Sena Akpalu. Khusboo Patel scored some fantastic goals, Bonita Wong's work rate was amazing and Freya Rose did superbly taking on the goal keeper's role during the season.

A very big thank you must go to Neville Clarke (Kylie's father) for his bus driving skills.

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Squash - Boys

Lynfield Senior Boys B had a strong year in squash, reaching the second stage championship pool of the Auckland competition for the Boys B teams. Within the second stage of the championship they performed well in their group and only lost to the team from Auckland Grammar, who went on to the Auckland final. During the year our number one player Henry Styles attained F grade in men's squash, which could mean that Lynfield can field a team at the next level up next year.

The first week of September is the NZ Secondary Schools Tournament Week – a chance for the top team in a code to compete against other such teams from throughout the country. Two Lynfield teams will be entering this year: Premier 1 Netball – playing 10 games over 5 days at Howick Pakuranga Netball (Lloyd Elsmore Park)

Girls 1st XI Football – playing 6 games over 5 days at Papakura

We wish them well and will include a summary in the newsletter on their return.

Teachers are top-of-mind for families with the winter school term underway and nominations now open for the ASG Teaching Awards and Cognition Education Leadership Awards.


Every two years parents, Boards of Trustees, parent associations, secondary student councils and community organisations can nominate the outstanding teachers and leaders in their school community who inspire learning.
