Dear Parents/Caregivers

We are now half way through this term and our students can feel proud of what they have achieved both in the classroom and in their extra-curricular involvement. Our College website has the latest information on students who have excelled at zone, regional and national competitions and we wish them well as they endeavour to qualify at higher levels.

Preparations are well underway for our annual Cultural Food and Performance Festival which will be held on Saturday 13 April. This is a wonderful opportunity for families of the school and the local community to celebrate the cultural diversity of our College. There will be a variety of cultural performances to view and ethnic foods to purchase. The day will run from 12.00 until 4.00pm.

Wireless Network

Lynfield College has just installed a comprehensive wireless network throughout the school. It has been trialled with the staff to ensure that any setup issues have been resolved. We are now in a position to open up the network to students so that they can use mobile devices at school to enhance their learning. The use of mobile devices in schools is becoming increasingly common and we believe that by providing access to the internet, students will be able to use it to gather, process and share information in support of their learning.

The school network comes with restrictions on its use and these are available to students in the "Acceptable Use Agreement (Wi-Fi)" which students must agree to follow before they can log in.

We currently have a number of classes in the junior school trialling iPads to support their learning. In 2014 we intend extending this by encouraging students to bring their own devices. At this stage we are still determining how we will implement this and incorporate the use of devices in class activities. Later in the year published guidelines will be made available to students and families.

I expect that students will appreciate the College's moves to enhance the learning opportunities for them through this initiative and will use the network in a responsible manner.

Sports Scene

Term 1 continues to be very, very busy in Lynfield sport. In the Sports Office we are working hard to increase the number of our students experiencing the enjoyment of participating in sport as well as promoting commitment, team spirit and school pride. Already we have increased the number of cricket teams from 2 to 4, table tennis from 0 to approximately 8 (TBC after trials currently being held), lawn bowls from 1 to 3 (possibly 4) and rugby teams from 1 to 3. Other winter sports are still holding musters and/or trials and at this stage, numbers for football, hockey, basketball and netball have increased to the point where there is likely to be at least one more team than last year in each code. We have also introduced 3 new competitive sports (dragon boating, orienteering and archery) to cater for a wider variety of skill bases and interests.

This week the boys were ecstatic when they found out they are the winners of the 2013 scholarship. Team Talk

Cricket

Our 1st XI Boys team continues to shine with some exceptional batting statistics and final results.

- Against Onehunga High 1st XI on 2 March, Lynfield batted first and scored 201-7 off 25 overs. In reply, Onehunga scored 144-7 off their 25 overs giving Lynfield a 57 run win. Akshay Chauhan (Y13) had a fantastic all round performance being the highest scoring batsman with 33 not out as well as taking 4 wickets for 19 runs.
- Last Saturday they played a home game against St Peter's 3rd XI. Lynfield scored 197-4 off 30 overs. Opening batsman, Jonty Pendigrast, (Y12) scored 39, then Saharsh Dhankawade (Y13) came in at #3 and notched up 112! This is an exceptional score in school cricket and the 2nd century this team has achieved this season. St Peter's were bowled out for 134. Rupin Kumar (Y9) took 4 wickets for 33 runs and Akshay Chauhan (Y13) took 3 for 21.
- Our Girls 1st XI comprises students from Y9 13. They remain undefeated and at the top of the table. On Wednesday they played McLean's College. It was a very, very exciting and tight game as McLean's chased our total of 113-4. Kayla Kesby (Y13) retired on 40. McLean's was bowled out for 92 after some outstanding fielding by Irisha Inamke (Y9) and Caidyn Kita (Y9). Irisha took 3 wickets for 20 runs off 4 overs, playing a significant part in securing a 21-run win for Lynfield.
- Our 2nd XI team played Mt Roskill Grammar last Saturday at Lynfield. Mt Roskill was all out for 112 runs in 21 overs. Lynfield reached their target of 113 for the loss of only 1 wicket on the 16th over, beating Mt Roskill's 3rd XI by 9 wickets! Well Done to Parthiv Patel (Y11) who took 5 wickets in his 5 overs and Esmat Ayoub (Y11) who scored 58 runs not out.
- Our **Junior Boys** team is having mixed success but all members are learning a lot and enjoying themselves immensely.

Orienteering

This is the first year Lynfield has entered the Secondary Schools Orienteering competition. Our team is Y9 and Y10 only and each week they compete at a different school each Wednesday afternoon. Lynfield hosted the schools in the western zone competition on 6 March. Congratulations to **Maddy Poland (Y10)** who won the Junior Girls grade while all others in our team finished in the top 2/3 of their grades.

Individual Honours

Congratulations **to Natalie Woodgate (Y13) who is currently Auckland's top female ocean swimmer.** The State Ocean Swim Series is held annually with increasingly large fields of males and females, amateurs and professionals. Natalie has had enormous success in these while competing in the women's non-wetsuit division. In the recent Rangitoto – St Heliers swim (4.6km) Natalie was 1st female to finish. Her time of 1hr 11min 2s also placed her 6th overall (9 min ahead of her nearest rival) in a field of men and women which included a number of professional ocean swimmers. This means that Natalie has won all three trophies of the Auckland Masters Harbour Swims this season. If she was old enough to actually be a member of a masters club, she would have won that trophy too! Natalie is significantly faster than any other amateur open water swimmer in the area, and has her sights set on catching the professionals. She is competing internationally (in Australia last month) and this will help build her experience to take on the professional women soon.
