## Dear Parents/Caregivers

Mid-year Reports are now being prepared and these will be issued on Thursday 11 July to senior and junior students. Progress Conference evenings will be held for students and their parents on 15 and 20 August in Term 3. The time lapse between issuing reports and having progress conferences is deliberate. It gives students the opportunity to work on the advice offered in the subject reports and so improve their academic performance before receiving more feedback at the conferences.

At this time of the year colds and flu are on the increase. Students can take some simple precautions to reduce the impact of these illnesses on themselves and fellow students by wearing appropriate winter school uniform, having adequate wet weather protection and washing and drying their hands properly. Those who are not well should remain at home so that they can recover more quickly and not spread their illness.

If any student is on medication or has health issues which are likely to impact on any aspect of their schooling, parents/caregivers should directly contact our school nurse and discuss the situation with her. Our school nurse, Mrs Glynne Newton is available on 627 0600 extension 755. In an emergency, our nurse is likely to be the first medic on the scene. Nurse Newton also needs to be notified by a parent when a student requires medication during the day. All medicine required by a student during the school day must be stored in her office. Your child's Dean should also be notified. If a student feels unwell after arriving at school, then he or she should go and see the Nurse in the first instance, who will contact parents or caregivers.

Now that winter is here, we are in need of school jerseys and jackets to loan to students who for a number of reasons do not have them. If you have any of these items that are no longer required by your family we would appreciate having them. You can deliver them to the reception desk at any time during the school day.

# Student Leader Profile - International Student Representative

Hello, Kia Ora, 你好,안녕하세요, こんにちは, ciao.

My name is Pam Komnatchanan, from Thailand. I am the International Student Representative for 2013. This is a fantastic opportunity for me but carries responsibilities which I take very seriously. I have been studying at Lynfield College for four years. I came here at the age of 14 and I started my first class at Year 10. Now I am 18 years old and this is my last year at the College.

So many people have asked me why I chose to come to New Zealand instead of the UK or USA. I looked really closely at all the information given about the school and my agent has been in touch with the International Department of Lynfield College for many years. I could see that New Zealand had an excellent environment for study, as well as offering life experiences that could not be found in Thailand. It was an easy choice to come to Lynfield College and I think that our other international students would share this point of view.



Our College has had international students for 18 years. There are over 100 international students from 15 different countries enrolled so far this year with most of them planning to graduate from Lynfield College and continue to study at universities in New Zealand or go back to their home country. Some of them come on an exchange programme, which allows them to experience New Zealand for a short period of time.

The most common reason for international students to study overseas is to improve their English skills. Another reason is that they prefer the school curriculum in New Zealand more than the school curriculum in their countries. Also, they have lots of opportunities to speak in English in New Zealand for everyday use.

Thus in my role, I have a responsibility and opportunity to help and listen to International Students, as I know what the feeling is like to be studying overseas, staying away from parents and making new friends. Fortunately, we have got classmates, teachers and International staff, as well as host families who can make things much easier for us.

Living with host families also gives us lots of opportunities to speak English, gain amazing life experiences in New Zealand and have someone to give us advice when we need help. I have been staying with my host family since I first came to New Zealand and they have been very kind and wonderful. They always chat with me so I can improve my English and take care of me, as I am part of their family. Also at school we have so many cultural groups that students can join, to make new friends and learn about different cultures.

So, I hope to not only support successful events and be a good helper for the international students who come from different countries, but also be part of the Lynfield College family that will give them valuable lifelong memories of their experiences in New Zealand.

## **NZQA Fees and Financial Assistance**

The 2013 NZQA fee for domestic students is \$76.70, with a maximum of \$200 per family. This includes up to three Scholarship subject entries. Extra Scholarship entries are \$76.70 per subject.

The cost for International fee paying students is \$383.30. This does not include Scholarship entries, which are \$102.20 per subject. Financial assistance cannot be claimed for International fee paying students.

Financial assistance is available for those who:

- > are receiving a Work and Income or Study Link benefit, or
- have a Community Services Card, or
- have a joint family income that would qualify for a Community Services Card, or
- have two or more children entered as candidates this year with fees totalling more than \$200.

(Where fees are payable for more than one candidate, a maximum of \$100 per child and \$200 per fee payer.) The fee for those qualifying for financial assistance in the first three categories is \$20, with a maximum of \$30 per family.

You must fill in an application form to receive financial assistance. <u>A new application has to be filled in each year</u> – if you received financial assistance last year it does not carry over.

**Financial assistance application forms are now available from the Deans' Reception.** The form should be completed and returned to school as soon as possible to ensure that students receive an invoice for the reduced amount when the billing run is done.

Invoices will be issued shortly, with payment due by the end of the term (12 July). Please plan for this payment so that you can help us to meet our NZQA deadlines. For most students, the fee will be \$76.70.

# **SPORTS SCENE**

The winter sports season is now under way for all sports and we continue to run two other weekly sports events as well as House Competitions and one off events such as the Road Race. An outline of these events is:

## **8M8S**

This can be enjoyed by any of our students, whether they are already involved in a sport or not. It is **FREE** and **NO ongoing commitment** is required. Students simply turn up when they can and stay for as long as they can. It is just for fun and a chance to taste some new sports.

Our 1<sup>st</sup> XI Boys Football played an awesome game on Tuesday at home against Long Bay College in a knockout tournament. Long Bay is actually near the top of the grade above Lynfield but we held them to a draw at full time. After extra time the score was 4 -4! This meant going to a penalty shootout situation and Lynfield lost out on their 3rd penalty. The margin doesn't get any closer than this!!

The **Premier 1 and Premier 2 Netball** teams have really shown the netball community we are a force to be reckoned with! Both have had very convincing wins in each of their games.

Our  $2^{nd}$  XI Girls Football team have just finished their first game of the season. In a hard fought match with Massey High, the girls showed real determination to pull off a 1-0 victory. This team is comprised of Y9-13 girls, many of whom have not played football before!

The 1st XV Rugby had a good win on Saturday and are showing much improvement as they start to gel as a team.

Despite being placed in a higher grade than expected, 1<sup>st</sup> XI Girls Hockey have had 2 wins from 3 games and are punching well above their weight as they are in a re-building phase having lost several Y13 players at the end of last season.

Nominated teachers and leaders receive a NEiTA Certificate of Nomination once verified, with 20 area representatives selected to go forward to receive Regional Awards in Wellington in May 2014. From these, 10 will receive National Awards and professional development grants of up to \$5000 at their schools or centres later in the year.
