Team Talk

It is great to see our junior sports teams showing real commitment and competing with consistent success: With only 1 game to go, the **Junior Boys Volleyball** team have continued their winning ways and are working hard in preparation for the Auckland Secondary Schools tournament next week.

Junior A and B Girls Volleyball teams are in the play offs for 1st, 2nd and 3rd in Division 1 and 2 (respectively) of the central Auckland competition.

Junior Softball Girls are making excellent progress and have had 3 wins from 3 games!

Junior Boys Touch has lost 1, drawn 1 and won 1 in the Central Boys B Grade competition.
