Dear Parents/Caregivers

Welcome to the second newsletter for the year.

Our Year 9 students have settled well into their school life at Lynfield, with the majority making the most of the new opportunities that are available to them. I would encourage our junior students to become involved in some of the many extracurricular activities offered at the College. This is a great way for students to develop pride and commitment to others within the school community. Students should read the daily notices during form time to keep informed about cultural and sporting opportunities that may arise. The daily notices are also posted on student noticeboards and on e-LynC.

Our Athletics Sports day was very successful. The House system encourages participation from all levels with some fierce competition in a variety of point-allocated events. From this day students were selected to take part in the College's inaugural Athletics Championships. This was followed by the Western Zone Athletics Championships where some outstanding results were achieved. Results from the day appear in the sports section of this newsletter.

In week 5 we held the NCEA Parents' Evening which was very well supported by parents keen to monitor the development and opportunities of their sons and daughters. It is very useful for parents and staff to exchange ideas and learn from each other about how to enhance student learning. If you attended this evening and have any further questions that may have arisen, please contact Deputy Principal Murray Black (Achievement, Assessment and Reporting) or Deputy Principal Cath Knell (Teaching and Learning).

On Tuesday 11 March a Maori Families Evening will be held at the College during which we will have the opportunity to discuss Māori education initiatives.

It is five years since our last review by the Education Review Office and on 17 March the school will be visited. ERO will be here for a week, looking at compliance and student achievement.

We are half way through Term 1 with teaching staff having undertaken assessment activities with all students. Progress Reports are currently being written, which will indicate the academic progress, effort and organisation and lessons missed of students in each subject. As such they will provide an indication to you of how focused and settled your children are in their learning and where support is required. All families received a copy of the homework pamphlet with Newsletter No. 1. This is a guide on how you can help with homework and what the school's expectations are. If you did not get one, you are able to download one from our website, ring and request one from reception or email your request to admin@lynfield.school.nz Progress Reports will be issued on Thursday 27 March.

Automobile Association Free Driving Lesson Programme

This programme was launched in Auckland on Monday 3 March, after a very successful response in other New Zealand cities.

- The free driving lesson is with an AA driving instructor and is for new drivers, to help set them on the right path towards achieving the skills necessary to be safe and competent drivers. Most students who have taken up the offer already are ages 16, so many students in Lynfield College will be eligible.
- To be eligible for the free driving lesson, the new driver needs to have held their learner's driver licence for less than two months and be either an AA member or the son or daughter of an AA member.

PhotoLife Online Ordering System

This year Lynfield College class photographs will be available for you to view and order online with PhotoLife Studios.

Your son or daughter will bring home an online slip with their unique Shoot Key detailed on it. This Shoot Key will automatically display your child's class photograph. It is then an easy process for you to shop online and purchase the photograph you want. The College will also receive a number of order envelopes for those of you who do not have access to the internet or do not wish to use this system.

If you place your order within two weeks of receiving your Shoot Key you will receive free delivery for your photo orders. PhotoLife has agreed to despatch all the orders back to the school and your child will bring the photographs home.

Any orders placed after this period will be sent directly to your specified delivery address and will incur a \$5.00 postage & packing charge. You will see this message when you go online to view and order your photographs.

Individual Honours

At the end of last year two students won very significant Auckland-wide awards while a third won a NZ title:

Shantael Ligaliga (Y10, 2013) was named as Runner-up for the NZ Pacific Island Young Sports Person of the Year Award. This award is for all school age Pasifika students, both male and female.

Liam van Rijn (Y13, 2013) won the ASB Young Sportsperson of the Year for Lawn Bowls.

Our congratulations to Liam and Shantael on winning these very prestigious awards.

Maddison Wesche (Y9, 2013) won the NZ Secondary Schools Junior Girls' Shot Put title with a distance that outstripped the senior girls!

While most of us were enjoying a lazy summer holiday many of our top sporting students continued with a gruelling training regime in their efforts to reach the highest level in their chosen sports. Several have already gained success this year:

Sam Hudson (Y10) competed during the holidays in NZ Archery National Championships at Whitianga, winning silver in the U15 target championship with a personal best score.

She^e Nathan-Wong (Y13) was selected as captain of the Auckland U17 Girls' Touch Team and also the Auckland U19 Girls' Touch Team.

David Nathan-Wong (Y9) was selected for the Auckland U15 Boys Elite Touch Team.

Alex Falaniko (Y12) gained selection to the Auckland U19 Tag Football team for the 2014 National Championships which were held late last month.

Shanaia Panapa-Ruri (Y11) was selected for the U21 Women's Waitakere Tag team.

Cree Braithwaite (Y12) was selected for U17 Waitakere Tag team.

Michael Carswell (Y11) has had several successes in cycling; Silver - Individual Pursuit and the 500 Time Trial; Bronze - Points race; Member of the Auckland Representative Team for the National Championships to be held in Invercargill.

Jemma Read (Y13) – has gained a double NZ cap! She has been selected in both the NZ Junior Women's In-Line Hockey team. She decided to push herself to take part in 8 hours of trials last weekend for the NZ Senior Women's In-Line Hockey team and was ecstatic when she found she had gained a place in this team too! Now Jemma will be playing in both teams in the World Championships in France in July.

Sports Scene

Athletics Day

Wow, what a day! With plenty of House spirit and fantastic participation in all aspects of the day by all students there was unprecedented House rivalry. Morning events were a mixture of track and field as well as tabloid. The most noise and excitement was generated in the Obstacle Course as junior classes and senior houses tried to get as many participants successfully through the course in 7 minutes.

The seniors had really let their creativity flow as they came up with some amazing outfits in their House colours – most designed and made by the students themselves. Best Dressed House, Best Mascot (and its presentation to the school) were both judged by an independent panel of staff who did a lot of head scratching to find clear winners!

The sprint finals and relays (house and form class) were hotly contested and showed we certainly have talent at all levels in these track events.

Athletics Championships

This was an inaugural event held off site at Margaret Griffen Park, which gave our serious athletes a chance to really show what they were capable of in field and middle distance track events. On the basis of previous performances, about 60 students were selected to compete. With a place in our Western Zone team at stake, competition was tough. It showed we have some outstanding talent in a wide range of athletics events, gave us a reliable set of records for juniors, intermediates and seniors (that will no doubt be hotly contested in future years) and provided a fair and robust system to determine our Athletics Champions.

This event was very much a community effort. Very special thanks must go to Jan and Andre Pitout for their organisation of the athletics events, Roskill South Athletics Club for the use of their equipment and facilities, the Sports Captains and House Captains and the wider Lynfield College community who all pulled together to make this such a success.

Western Zone Athletics Championships

Our WZ Athletics team was very competitive with several winning the right to compete in the Greater Auckland Secondary Schools Athletics meet later this month. Of special note were:

Maddison Wesche (Y10) who continued to wow the crowds as she competed in the Intermediate Girls Shot Put. She won with a put of 14.26m creating a new Auckland Secondary Schools record! This smashed the previous record of 14.10m. Maddy will now go to the Greater Auckland Secondary Schools Athletics meet as No.1 favourite for this event, but before that she is off to Australia to represent NZ in the Australian Athletics champs.

Summer Sports

The 2014 summer season is well under way with approximately 200 students competing in regular weekly interschool team competitions in cricket, dragon boating, golf, orienteering, touch, and volleyball.

Cricket

After some key players moved on to tertiary education, our 1st XI is in a re-building phase and has had mixed success including a win by 5 wickets against Mt Roskill Grammar, and a 9 wicket win over Rutherford in the 2nd Gillette Cup game. Of special note was an outstanding batting score of 110 not out, scored by Darshan Mehta (Y12) against MAGS.

Dragon boating

The word is out that this sport is for anyone who likes a team sport which is heaps of fun! With no experience needed, no trials and 24 in each boat, Dragon boating has attracted 80 very committed students who train weekly at Westhaven. They will compete in the Auckland Secondary schools regatta on Lake Pupuke on 23 March. This is a full-on day with the first race at 8am and the last one about 5pm. After the fantastic fun the paddlers had last year, we are really looking forward to an awesome day!

Golf

Our golf team, comprising Shantael Ligaliga (Y11), Jocelyn Katu (Y12), Brock Dormer (Y13) and James Samountry (Y13), are in the 1st division for the all-Auckland competition. They have played three games so far and have had one narrow loss, one very convincing win and one close victory - their first ever win over Kings College. Although ours is a mixed team (comprised of boys and girls), all the other teams in this division of the competition are boys only. Our opposition is learning not to take the talent of our girls lightly!

Orienteering

About 10 students are now enjoying this competition which is held on the grounds of a different school each week. Each student competes individually to find all the check points in the fastest possible time.

Touch

Our Senior Boys and Senior Girls teams play each Tuesday at Cox's Bay reserve. They are both focussing on skill development and smart strategies on the field and their games are showing plenty of growth and are becoming very competitive very quickly! Both teams have had some wins and some losses.

Volleyball

Both teams compete each Thursday – Senior Boys are always at Rutherford College while the Senior Girls play a mixture of home and away games. The boys' team is primarily Y11s and are gaining in strength as they face more experienced teams but have proved to others they are a very competitive bunch!

At time of writing, the Seniors Girls Team is competing in the Auckland Secondary Schools tournament at the Trusts Stadium. This is the first time for several years we have competed in the tournament and the girls have trained very hard in their build up to this competition. They are currently undefeated at the end of pool play on the first day. Watch this space!

Winter Sports

The Basketball Academy is well underway with a selected group of students who are committed to substantially improving their skills in this sport. Pre-season training for rugby, football and netball is happening weekly and trials for most teams in all sports will take place over the next two weeks. Without your help to manage, coach or transport one of our teams this year, we definitely could not provide sporting opportunities to such a large number of students. Remember, to manage a team you do not need knowledge of the sport, just to be a channel for communication between coach and players as needed and help organise (not necessarily provide) transport to games. We will not enter a team into a competition unless it has both a coach and a manager!
