#### **Dear Parents/Caregivers**

Thank you to the many parents and caregivers who attended the student progress conferences held during the past two weeks. 3,221 interview bookings were made over the two evenings, which ensured that valuable feedback on students' progress was gained by parents and teaching staff. Over the next two weeks senior students should follow through on any advice and revision guidelines recommended by their teachers to ensure success in the senior exams which begin in week 8 of this term.

Many parents and students also took this opportunity to gain further information and advice on course selection for 2015. All Year 10 - 12 students have now been issued with the 2015 Senior Course Information booklet. Students who were absent at the time these booklets were distributed should see their Form Teachers. Please take time to discuss option choices and career paths with your children. It is essential that pages 2 - 7 of this booklet are read very carefully, particularly the course prerequisite and University Entry requirements, before making course selection decisions. Within these introductory pages are listed the school staff who are able to assist you in making these important decisions. A file copy of the Senior Course Information booklet can be opened from the front page of e-LynC or from the Curriculum section of our website.

Year 10 – 12 students are required to hand their completed course selection forms to their Form Teachers by **Monday 18** August.

Year 9 students have also been issued with their course selection information booklets for Year 10, 2015. Their completed course selection forms should be handed to their Form Teachers by **Monday 25 August**.

Parents are encouraged to enter their child's selections on the Parent Portal. If you have been unable to do this, please indicate that on the form. We are using the two systems simultaneously this year, with the backup of a paper copy.

#### Student Representative, Board of Trustees 2014 - 2015

Students are invited to nominate themselves or another student to be the Student Representative on the Board of Trustees for 2014 – 2015. The role of the student representative is to provide input to the BOT, based on the perspectives of the students they represent. They can make valuable contributions to decisions that affect the strategic direction of the school. Nomination forms and additional information are available from the Returning Officer, Mr Waddington. Nominations will close at noon on Tuesday 9 September and the election will be held on Tuesday 23 September. Results will be announced Friday 26 September.

Michael finished a very creditable 5<sup>th</sup> in the U17 Boys Road Race, but it was on the track he really shone. Sam Dashfield (Y10) and Ben Roughan (Y12) were members of the Auckland U17 Indoor Cricket team when it won the interprovincial tournament held in Wellington during the recent school holidays. Both Ben and Sam are members of our 1 st XI Cricket team.

Michael Durham (Y12) is again a NZ Junior Men's Figure Skating Representative. He has recently represented NZ in Dunedin and will also skate for NZ at the ISU Junior Grand Prix in Nagoya, Japan 8-15 September.

She^e Nathan-Wong (Y13) gained selection to the Auckland West U18 Girl's Secondary Rugby Team.

Kieren Chhiba (Y9) is one of only 3 Y9 students throughout Auckland who have been selected as members of the Auckland U15A Boys' Hockey team. Kieren is a member of our 1<sup>st</sup> XI Hockey team.

Tayla Wesche (Y13) gained selection to the Netball North Harbour U19 Netball team. Tayla is a member of our very successful Premier 1 Netball team.

Jocelyn Katu (Y12) & Shantael Ligaliga (Y11) are representing Auckland in interprovincial tournaments after selection to the Auckland Women's Golf team. Both Jocelyn and Shantael are members of our Golf team.

Esmeralda Ligaliga (Y12) has been selected in the Auckland Junior Women's Golf team

Juee Bhide (Y13) has been selected as a member of the Auckland Senior Women's Squash team. Juee is ranked too highly to compete in a school team but has coached our girls' squash team for 5 years.

Our congratulations to two of our former students who have featured in international competitions recently are: **Katie Bowen (Y13, 2011)** is captain of the NZ U20 White Ferns Football team competing in the U20 World Football Cup. **Stephanie McKenzie (Y13, 2010)** finished 4<sup>th</sup> in the track cycling sprint at the Glasgow Commonwealth games.

#### World Inline Hockey report.

You may remember **Jemma Read (Y13)** represented NZ in both the Junior and the Senior Women's Inline Hockey Teams. Below is a very brief account of her amazing experiences in this team.

"Just before the school holidays started, I flew off to France for 3 weeks to compete in the FIRS World Inline Hockey Championships. This was the first time I had been selected to represent NZ for Junior and Senior Women. Senior Women retained 'Top 4' world ranking, after coming first in our pool (with Italy, Mexico, Brazil) and beating Namibia in the quarter finals before losing to Canada in the semi, and Spain in the playoff for 3rd + 4th. Although we just missed out on a medal, it was a challenge competing against the top hockey playing countries in the world – 16 in total - but we played with pride and passion every game.

Next was the Juniors tournament which was held in a very small rink. It consisted of top ranking U19 players from various countries such as USA, Spain, Colombia, Canada, Australia, Great Britain and Namibia. Our scores were really close, even against countries that had a lot more backing behind the sport - like Canada who only beat us 2-1. We placed 7<sup>th</sup>. Wearing a NZ jersey was one of the best feelings, and I hope to do the same next year in Argentina!"
