Payments through the Parent Portal

Our apologies for the misleading information in the last newsletter regarding payments to the College. These are now paid online through the Parent Portal at the top of our website Home Page (the e-payments link has been discontinued).

Progress Conferences

Parents are asked, wherever possible, to attend the conferences on the day which corresponds with the first letter of the student's surname.

Thursday 10 April (student surnames A - L), 4 - 7pm Tuesday 15 April (student surnames M - Z), 4 - 7pm

All parents/caregivers are expected to visit their child's teachers on one of these afternoons as it is a part of the school/home partnership so vital to a student's progress. Information about our on line appointment booking schedule will be made available in our next newsletter. Students will be released at 2.20pm on these days. The HCD buses will depart from Boundary Road at 2.30pm.

Booking Parent Interview Times On-line

All our parent interviews are booked using an **on-line booking** system. Access to make bookings will be opened for appointments after the reports are issued on Thursday 27 March.

The on-line booking system offers parents the opportunity to directly select the time at which they wish to meet teachers. Access to the School Interviews website is through the internet using the URL address http://www.schoolinterviews.co.nz. (If you are reading this online you can click on this link to make your booking.) Once logged on to this web page there are three simple steps to follow in order to complete the booking process. Included with the report is a personalised instruction sheet that includes the password and a printed copy of the student's courses and teachers' codes. This information can be used to ensure the interview times are made with the relevant staff member. Parents should print out the email confirmation and bring it to the interview to enable the booking times to be followed. (Please note that some email confirmations can end up in the junk-mail / spam folder of an email system – please check this if a reply does not appear immediately in your in-box.)

Any parents unable to access the booking website should complete the manual booking slip on the instruction sheet and send this back to the school office with their child. Receptionist staff will also be able to make bookings through the school office - phone 627 0600. The exact times for the interviews will be confirmed either by email or on the student's slip which will be returned to you.

Further information about managing the interview process is given with the instruction sheet.

We trust our parents will continue to be pleased with the on-line interview booking; it is certainly a very efficient means of ensuring Progress Conferences proceed in a scheduled and timely manner. We would appreciate any feedback about your use of this system – please contact Deputy Principal, Mr Black.

Automobile Association Free Driving Lesson Programme

This programme was launched in Auckland at the beginning of March, after a very successful response in other New Zealand cities.

- The free driving lesson is with an AA driving instructor and is for new drivers, to help set them on the right path towards achieving the skills necessary to be safe and competent drivers. Most students who have taken up the offer already are ages 16, so many students in Lynfield College will be eligible.
- To be eligible for the free driving lesson, the new driver needs to have held their learner's driver licence for less than two months and be either an AA member or the son or daughter of an AA member.

Individual Honours

Volleyball Success

Last week the Senior Girls Volleyball Team competed in the Auckland Secondary Schools tournament at the Trusts Stadium. This is the first time for several years we have competed in this and the girls trained very hard in their build up to this competition. They went through pool play without a loss, winning each game in two straight sets. They continued their winning streak by defeating Glendowie College and completely dominated One Tree Hill College in the semi-finals with a disciplined display of technically sound volleyball and excellent teamwork.

In the final against Avondale College, Lynfield won the first set convincingly but were narrowly beaten in the second set. The third set saw some really exciting rallies with both teams determined to win. The scores remained locked together throughout this set causing the game to go into extra time. Finally, Avondale managed to score a 2 point win (18 – 16) making Lynfield Runners-up in Division 2 of the AKSS Senior Girls Volleyball Championships. Congratulations girls.

While the tournament was in progress selectors were talent scouting to find the best players of the entire tournament. Congratulations to River Gavet (Y13) who was selected for the Auckland Secondary Schools Senior Girls Volleyball Tournament team. She was the only player from Division 2 to receive this honour which means she was the best player of Division 2 and one of the best 13 girls in the tournament!
