Dear Parents/Caregivers

We are now six weeks through Term 2 with three weeks to go. Our senior students have had 18 weeks of class time and are well over half way through their school year with 14 weeks of class time remaining before they go on study leave prior to their NCEA exams. Reports are currently being written and these will be issued to all students in the last week of this term.

Now that winter is here, we are in need of school jerseys and jackets to loan to students who for a number of reasons do not have them. If you have any of these items that are no longer required by your family we would appreciate having them. You can deliver them to the reception desk at any time during the school day.

Please check that your child has correct winter uniform items and correct footwear. Black leather shoes are the only shoes allowed - no canvas, boots, hightops or sports shoes. Winter jerseys, jackets, beanies and scarves are available from the uniform shop. Non-uniform sweaters and jackets are not permitted. Similarly, black jeans are not part of the school uniform, and are not acceptable under any circumstances. Please note that items are to be worn as designed - for example, the girl's senior pencil skirt is to be worn at knee length and if shortened will have to be replaced. From Term 3 we will send senior students home if they are incorrectly dressed so that they can change into the correct uniform. Thank you for your support of the College.

## Lynfield LynC App

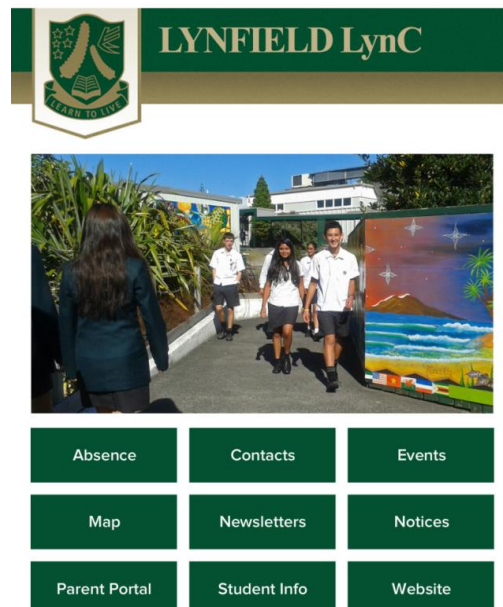
The Lynfield College app has been launched to students and staff. This app enables the community to keep up to date with what is happening at Lynfield College. Features of the app include:

Tickets are on sale and students are able to purchase tickets from a sales desk during lunchtimes. Members of the public may also purchase tickets from Reception.

## NZQA Fees and Financial Assistance

The 2014 NZQA fee for domestic students is \$76.70, with a maximum of \$200 per family. This includes up to three Scholarship subject entries. Extra Scholarship entries are \$76.70 per subject.

The cost for International fee paying students is \$383.30. This does not include Scholarship entries, which are \$102.20 per subject. Financial assistance cannot be claimed for International fee paying students.

Financial assistance is available for those who:

- are receiving a Work and Income or Study Link benefit, or
- have a Community Services Card, or
- have a joint family income that would qualify for a Community Services Card, or have two or more children entered as candidates this year with fees totalling more than \$200. (Where fees are payable for more than one candidate, a maximum of \$100 per child and \$200 per fee payer.)

The fee for those qualifying for financial assistance in the first three categories is \$20, with a maximum of \$30 per family.

It recognises the many challenges they face to reach their goals and encourages dedication and commitment to their chosen field of expertise, their academic studies as well as just enjoying being a teenager! Regular meetings provide our NZ Reps with the opportunity to share ideas with other likeminded students in the school and to chat relatively informally with a variety of guests who can offer advice on how to reach their goals, survive the journey, enjoy the thrills and prepare a 'Plan B' should it be needed.

#### Future Stars

On Friday 6 June about 300 of our Y9 & 10 students were asked to meet in the Upper Gym for no apparent reason. It soon became obvious that special guests were on the agenda as several TV reporters and cameras were being strategically positioned. Nua Finau was the MC and introduced **TJ Faiane** and **Leon Fukofuka**, members of the NZ U20 Rugby team competing in the Junior World Cup. With the recent wet and windy weather it is now starting to feel like winter on the side lines of our sports teams! Our winter teams continue to impress both with their rapidly growing team spirit, their self-discipline and their results.

**1<sup>st</sup> XIII Rugby League** is experiencing its 1<sup>st</sup> season in the Premier grade. They are really developing as a unit and their team work is now impressive. They have shown huge growth in their mental and physical game and are reaping the rewards. After losing to Papatoetoe High 4-34 2 weeks ago, in our home game last Wednesday, Lynfield kept the pressure on throughout the game to score a 22-22 draw. ### Individual Honours

Our students continue to stamp their mark on NZ sport as some reach the elite level in their chosen field. Most recently, congratulations to:

**Ben Hammond (Y12)** competed in the NZ Salsa Congress in Wellington over Queen's Birthday Weekend. He again competed with his partner Georgia (from Rangitoto College) and also in his "Illuminotme" team. It is fair to say that Ben was the star of the show in every sense as commanded the panel of international judges' attention. He won the right to represent NZ in Sydney at the Latin Festival both in individual and team events. His "Illuminotme" dance with Georgia (which they choreographed in a very short time) won the prize for "Most creative and energetic choreography in NZ"! Ben's performances were of such a high standard that he was named "Young Rising Star of NZ Salsa" and to top it off "King of Congress 2014". His performances can be viewed on line and are very entertaining, incredibly skilful and unbelievably athletic!

**Michael Carswell (Y11)** has been having considerable success in his road cycling competitions. In a recent Auckland-wide secondary schools race series "North Harbour Junior Tour" which included two 50km races in one day, a 1km time trial and a Criterion event. Michael finished 4<sup>th</sup> overall out of a field of 80 competitors in his class.

**Jodie Loveday (Y13)** has won selection to the U19 National Futsal Team for AFF.

**Grace Kukutai (Y13)** has recently returned from Adelaide where she was a member of the NZ Secondary Schools Netball Team which competed in the Australasian Secondary School Netball Tournament. She was in the starting line-up and played at WD in earlier games then at C for the finals against Australia. The NZSS team remained undefeated throughout the tournament to bring home the Trans-Tasman trophy. Grace thrived on the experience and took all opportunities to absorb the atmosphere and all aspects of being a member of a NZ team competing internationally.

**Stephanie McKenzie (Y13, 2010)** has very recently been named in the NZ Commonwealth Games Track Cycling team to compete in Glasgow in July. Stephanie is a 4 times National Champion in the 200m and 500m sprint and is the only female sprinter chosen for the Commonwealth Games team. She has been cycling competitively for about 10 years and while at Lynfield was also a very successful weight lifter. She was a recipient of a gold Don Oliver Youth Award in 2010. Stephanie has a very hefty training schedule, is in the 4th year of her University degree and works 20hrs/week to help meet her costs. Her time management skills are very well honed and she has her eyes firmly on the prize! We wish her well and will watch with interest as she races, beginning on July 24.

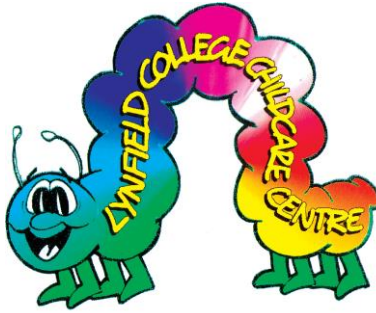
