Rex Dawkins Football Tournament

The 1st XI Boys Football team recently embarked on their first tournament outside the annual exchange with Mt Maunganui. This year the Rex Dawkins tournament was held in Papamoa. The team was captained by Nathan Maisey and vice captained by Kaleb Bowles who demonstrated sound leadership and pushed the boys' performance all week, leading by example on and off the field.

Huge congratulations to the 1st XI Football team for placing 4th in the Rex Dawkins Football tournament. The boys had an extremely successful week making it through pool play with four wins and a which won them a quarter final spot with John Paul College whom they beat 2-1. This put the boys into a semi-final with Kingsway College. In a game played out like a final the boys unfortunately lost 3-2 in what was a fiercely contested game. Kingsway would go on to play Burnside College in the final, with Burnside taking the honours 3-1. Lynfield College played Kapaiti College for 3rd and 4th and were beaten 3-0. A special mention must go to Kim Beale, the 1st XI coach, who has lead the boys all season and who moulded this group of students into serious contenders for more accolades in 2016. Olympic Sticks Hockey Tournament

Fresh after winning the Open Boys B/C Championship, the 1st XI Boys Hockey team travelled to North Harbour to participate in the 2015 Olympic Sticks National Tournament.

Competition over the week was intense and fast paced – drawing out remarkable strength and skill from each and every member of the team.

A shaky start to the week saw Lynfield draw against Cambridge High School (2-2). Changing tactics, however, brought wins against Freyburg High School (4-1), Te Kura Kaupapa o Ruamata (3-2) and Glendowie College (3-1).

These games were followed by a fiercely played semi-final against Aquinas College (2-1), bringing a narrow loss for Lynfield. The team went on to verse Papatoetoe College in a nail-biting play-off that saw Papatoetoe pull ahead with a 6-3 win.

After a week of incredible hockey, *Lynfield finished fourth overall for the Olympic Sticks tournament* – the highest ranking it has ever achieved. This brings to close a stellar season for the team, which has achieved some of the best results in recent years.

We say goodbye to some quality players who have served the team well over the last few years, notably Divek Lal, Kieren van Leeuwen, Jay Chauhan, Aakash Patel, James Mills, Anup Menon and Christian Lumangtad. The team was very lucky to have Raj Chauhan as the coach for the past 4 years.
