If they have lost their individualised form they should see Mr Waddington, Academic Advisor, for a replacement.

We recommend that students return their text books to the Library on the last day of their examinations.

Year 13 students will complete Leavers' Day as in previous years, <u>reporting to the school Hall at 9 am on 3 December</u> to return their completed clearance form, then receive their Yearbook and Leaving Certificate.

If Year 13 students lose their individualised clearance form, they should see Mr Waddington, Academic Advisor for a replacement.

# Year 9 and Year 10 - Caring for our Community (C4C) Programme, Tuesday 1 & Wednesday 2 December

At the end of each year Lynfield College runs a cross-curricular programme for our junior students. This is scheduled to take place after feedback on exams has been returned to the students. The theme is 'Caring for our Community' with both Year 9 and Year 10 students involved.

The aim of the C4C programme is to encourage the students to be actively involved in the community in which they live. This is a good opportunity to encourage them to look at the world from another point of view and to look beyond themselves. Doing something for someone else is a way of achieving this. This supports many of the principles, values and key competencies of the New Zealand curriculum, including community engagement, integrity, participating and contributing and relating to others. 
# **Homework Centres**

Making the right decisions about jobs, training and careers can be difficult. Careers NZ can help you and your family make sense of the huge amount of information available to you. Careers NZ is the government agency that provides free and independent information and advice about jobs, courses, training and careers. Contact Careers NZ by talking online with a careers expert at <a href="https://www.careers.govt.nz">www.careers.govt.nz</a>, chat to an advisor on 0800 222 733, or free text CAREER to 434.

Y13 students planning on tertiary study next year should apply for their Student Allowances and Loans before 16 December. First time applicants can do this by using RealMe. Students can sign up online for their Real Me verified identity and then get a free photo taken to complete the process at participating Post Shops. This means students can prove who they are without having to provide copies of a passport of birth certificate. By applying early, students will allow enough time for all

the steps in the application process to be completed before their course starts. It's not necessary for students to have their NCEA results or have locked down all their study plans.

**Agricultural and equine taster experiences, 14-17 December.** A great opportunity to find out if a job in the primary industries is for you and what it's like to learn at Taratahi. Activities include hands-on experiences with quad bikes, chainsaws, fencing, engineering, stock handling, tractors and more. Equine activities take place at Panorama Equestrian Centre. # University of Auckland Business School Open Day for Y13 Maori & Pacific Students – Thursday 3 & Friday 4 December.

The initial deadline for students applying to enrol in an undergraduate course at The University of Auckland Business School is 8th December (but note that students can still make late applications after that date). In our experience, many students want to go to university but are undecided up to the last minute as to what course they should enrol in.

The University of Auckland are offering undecided Maori & Pacific school students the chance to come in to the Business School after their exams to find out more about:

- Business as a career and studying business at the Business School
- The welcoming environment for Maori & Pacific students at the Business School

This is also an opportunity for students who have decided to apply for a place at the Business School to attend to gain more information. Students should arrive at the Business School at 10am either day, where they will be greeted. The visit will take a couple of hours and include refreshments. The Business School is located in the centre of the city, in the Owen G Glenn Building, 12 Grafton Road, Auckland.
