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Dear Parents/Caregivers

Welcome to the second newsletter for the year.

Our Year 9 students have settled well into their school life at Lynfield, with the majority making the most of the new opportunities that are available to them. I would encourage our junior students to become involved in extra-curricular activities offered at the College. This is a great way for students to meet different people and also to share in the wider community. Students should read the daily notices during form time to keep informed about cultural and sporting opportunities that may arise. The daily notices are also posted on student noticeboards and on e-LynC.

Our Athletics Sports day was very successful. The House system encourages participation from all levels with some fierce competition in a variety of point-allocated events. From this day students were selected to take part in the College's Athletics Championships. Results from the days appear in the sports section of this newsletter.

In the past two weeks, we have held two parents' evenings – Year 9 Parents' Evening and NCEA Information Evening - both very well supported by parents keen to monitor the development of opportunities for their sons and daughters. It is very useful for parents and staff to exchange ideas and learn from each other about how to enhance student learning. If you attended these evenings and have any further questions that may have arisen, please contact Deputy Principal Steven Mouldey or Deputy Principal Richard Winn.

On Friday 11 March a Whānau Hui will be held at the College Te Ringa Āwhina Marae at 6.30pm, where we especially look forward to seeing our Kapa Haka students perform before their participation in Polyfest.

We are half way through Term 1 with teaching staff having undertaken assessment activities with all students. Progress Report writing has begun. These reports will indicate the academic progress, effort, organisation and lessons missed by students in each subject. As such they will provide an indication to you of how focused and settled your children are in their learning and where support is required. In Newsletter No. 1 all families are made aware of the homework pamphlet that can be accessed on our website. This is a guide on how you can help with homework and what the school's expectations are. **Progress Reports will be issued on Wednesday 23 March.** An individualised information sheet about our on line appointment booking schedule will accompany reports.

Digital Devices at Home

The College has been approached by parents seeking advice on how to deal with students and their devices in the home, particularly late at night.

- Talk with your child about any concerns you have and why.
- Know what homework is being done on the device. Ask how long they think it will take. See evidence of what is achieved.
- For juniors it would be very unusual for a student to need to be doing homework after 9pm.
- If online activities such as gaming are an issue, turn off the WiFi between certain times.
- Devices used at school need to be charged each night and we suggest leaving the device in a shared space rather than in your child's bedroom.
- You can always keep the device for times that you think are appropriate.


The College Library opens at 8.00am remains open after school every day <u>until 3.40pm</u>, providing an excellent homework space for all students.

It allows our serious athletes a chance to really show their capabilities in field and middle distance track events in a more official setting. About 45 students were selected to compete, based on their performance on Athletics Day &/or performance during PE lessons relating to athletics. With places in our Central/West Zone team at stake, competition was tough. It showed we have some outstanding talent in a wide range of athletics events, gave us a reliable set of records for juniors, intermediates and seniors and provided a fair and robust system to determine our Athletics Champions.

This event was very much a community effort. Very special thanks must go to Roskill South Athletics Club for the use of their equipment and facilities, and to Alastair and Nathan Maisey and Numia Kennerly for their organisation of equipment, staff and Sports Captains who all pulled together to make this such a success. Thirty-one athletes qualified for the Central/West Zone meet at Mt Smart Wednesday 9 March - our biggest team for many years.

Summer Sports

Fickle weather over the past week has caused several games to be cancelled; however there have been a large number of wins for the teams who have competed.

Tennis

As with most of our sports, we have some competitive and some social tennis teams. Consequently results are mixed but all are enjoying their sport.

Volleyball

Our senior boys' team remains at the top of their section of the weekly competition! These boys are training 5 times/week and have their sights firmly set on the Auckland Secondary Schools Championships to be held at The Trusts stadium next week (10 – 12 March). All supporters are most welcome.

The senior girls team is also involved in a rigorous training regime and improving noticeably each game.

Cricket

The 1st XI Girls team dominated EGGS this week when they bowled them all out for 82 runs. Lynfield scored 85 – 3 wickets, giving them a win by 4 wickets!

The **1**st **XI Boys** played Selwyn College last Saturday. Lynfield batted first and scored 169 runs for 9 in 30 overs then bowled Selwyn out for 133 runs in the 28th over. This gave Lynfield College a 36 run victory! Everyone played well, particularly Rupin Kumar who scored 57 runs and bowlers Kiran Patel (4 wickets) and Yash Patel (6 overs, 2 wickets just for 2 runs)!

The **Junior A Boys** team had another big win on Saturday. Lynfield knocked up 120 runs for the loss of 5 wickets. In reply, Kingsway were all out for 42 giving Lynfield a win by 78 runs!

Our newly formed **Junior B Boys** cricket team played a good 1st game of the season, although the result was not what they might have wished for. Batting first, Lynfield set the pace low at 94 for 10 wickets. Although their bowling was far stronger than their batting, a strong batting side from De La Salle meant that once they passed 94, they called end of game. This group is hugely enthusiastic and committed. They are lucky to have Rupin Kumar (Y12) as coach and they will have lots to work on at training this week before the next game!

Orienteering

39 students from all year levels have now competed in the 1st 2 events (at Waitakere and Avondale Colleges) of the series which is held on the grounds of a different school each week. Each competes individually to find all the check points in the fastest possible time. All have really enjoyed the chance to combine physical and mental exercise get all check points in the right order in the shortest possible time.
