The week was preceded by intense training sessions and a lot of organisation by our Sports Office staff and the outside coaches who accompanied their teams. Senior Assessment period continues next week, finishing on Friday 22 September. All senior students (Year 11-13) will have exams and or workshops to attend during this assessment time. These will include internal assessments, opportunities to complete portfolio-based work or practice for the external NCEA exams.

It is important that all senior students attend these workshops/exams – should, for any reason, a student be unable to attend the end of year NCEA External Examinations their grade from the practice external exams could potentially be used as a derived grade.

The morning assessment time slot starts at 8.30am and the afternoon time slot starts at 1.00pm. When students do not have an assessment or workshop they are encouraged to not be on school site. There is a study room available (B3) if needed.

Team Talk

NZ Secondary Schools Winter Tournament Week

The winter sports season wrapped up with NZSS Tournament Week (4 - 8 September). This year five Lynfield teams competed in various tournaments, playing schools from all over the North Island. The experience for the players is far greater than just the time actually playing the games. It is a unique and invaluable opportunity for many of our best sportspeople to be part of the intensity of a top level competition, day in, day out for a week and also to share the highs, lows and fun with other like-minded players and school mates.

Congratulations to all our players who represented Lynfield with pride and passion, playing hard but fair. This year's game results were again impressive:

1st XI Girls Football - 4th in "Kathy Seaward" tournament (24 teams competed in Whangarei)
 1st XI Boys Hockey - 7th in "Olympic Stick" tournament (15 teams competed in Pukekohe)
 1st XI Boys Football - 3rd in "Trident" tournament (24 teams competed in Hamilton)
 Jnr Boys Badminton - 21st in "Senior Boys Badminton" tournament (25 teams in Napier)

Premier 1 Netball - 2nd in "Upper North Island Secondary Schools" B grade (120 teams competed at Mt Wellington)

Our **Premier 1 Netball** team competed at the Upper North Island Secondary Schools(UNISS) tournament which, this year, was hosted by Auckland Netball at Mt Wellington. At this tournament only the top team from each of 120 schools is able to compete.

Throughout the week they played 10 hard games, each team desperately wanting the win to allow them passage to the upper section of the next round. After narrowly losing our first (by 4 goals), our girls really gelled and set their eyes on the prize. By the end of the third game we had beaten Mt Roskill and Auckland Diocesan College to gain a place in the top 16 of the B grade, which consisted of 32 teams. From there we had wins over Taupo, Kaitaia, Thames and Kerikeri, drew with Pakuranga and lost by 2 goals to Matamata. These results won us a place in the final of the B grade v Whangaparaoa. It was a very tough game and our girls fought to the end but were just not able to pull off a win.

Finishing 2nd in B grade is a seriously fantastic achievement and wins us promotion to A grade for UNISS 2018 which will be hosted by Harbourside Netball at Mt Maunganui.

The 1st **XI Boys Hockey** team played some excellent hockey, against some fairly stiff competition. Two head injuries (fortunately not too serious) proved to be a challenge throughout the week. However, although they didn't win the tournament, the boys were very pleased with their win over Mt Roskill Grammar on Friday; a win which secured them 7th place overall in the tournament.

Summer Sport

Selection trials are underway for junior summer sports - rugby 7s, volleyball, touch and softball. Competitions for these teams begin early next term and are held at local venues.

Next term, boys cricket teams (senior and junior) continue their season started in Term 1.
