




Year 9 Orientation Programme



NCEA Results 2023

In summary:

Year 11: 15.5% of students had their level certificate endorsed with Excellence and 37.6% endorsed with Merit.

Year 12: 19.5% of students had their level certificate endorsed with Excellence and 29.2% endorsed with Merit.

Year 13: 10.9% of students were endorsed with Excellence and 32.2% at Merit.

Note: These are interim results and may vary slightly before finalised in March by NZQA.

REPORTING

A new reporting system will be initiated in 2024 for all College students. Instead of two reports during the year (mid year and end of year), reports will be issued regularly in Weeks 3, 6 and 9 of each term. It is anticipated that the reports will be uploaded to the College's Parent Portal on Thursday evening of those weeks.

The report will show "engagement in learning" grades for each subject. Engagement covers aspects of learning such as punctuality, effort, organisation and being prepared for learning. The report will form a basis for regular discussions with students at home, at school, and the Parent-Student-Teacher Conferences held during the year (Terms 1 and 3). The frequency of reporting will enable ongoing conversations regarding student engagement at school with learning along with recognising those students who are doing well and others that need support. Academic progress and attendance information will be available separately on the Parent Portal.


There will be five possible colour-coded grades for engagement in learning:



Each issue of the report will contain all engagement grades since the start of the year. Grades added during the year will reflect the engagement since the previous entry i.e. over the preceding three weeks.

Wellbeing Survey 2024

As part of our continued efforts to support students' wellbeing we will be once again completing the "GoodSpace Schools Wellbeing Survey" across all our year levels.

This survey takes a confidential look at a wide variety of aspects of wellbeing including: School Life, Self-care, Belonging, Home Life, Identity & Sexuality and Mental Health. We run this survey in year level groups. The whole school will be able to complete the survey in weeks 4 and 5 (19th February through to 4th March). Students will be encouraged to complete this survey in their Hui mai time.

The generalised data is incredibly helpful for directing our attention and resources to things that are relevant for certain year levels and the school as a whole. It may also highlight individual students who may be struggling. These students will be offered the opportunity to meet with one of the counselling team for an individual, confidential counselling session.
