## **Coming Event: Parent Student Teacher Conferences**

Our Term 1 Parent, Student, Teacher (PST) Conferences will take place on:

Thursday 11 April (from 1.00pm to 7.00pm) and Friday 12 April (9.00am to 1.00pm)

The appointments will be for 15 minutes. The meetings can be **either face to face or online** however, all bookings will receive a Google Meet link. Your child's Hui mai teacher will ask which option you plan to use prior to the meeting.

The focus of the meeting will be on your child's start to the year at Lynfield. This will include conversations around goal setting, engagement, what is going well and where improvements can be made. Students are expected to attend these conferences with you, and to lead the conversation.

## Attendance v Achievement

Turning up and being in class has a significant impact on student performance and achievement. Our high expectations are that students are at school above 90% of the time to allow each individual to achieve to their own 'personal excellence'.

The more time students are away form the classroom the more difficult they find it to engage back into learning. How many times have we heard 'I was away, I don't know what I'm doing'? The longer students are out of the classroom the more difficult it is to engage meaningfully back into their learning.

Lynfield College Attendance Vs Success in 2023 shows just how relevant and important turning up is. The table below shows students who miss less than ONE day a fortnight are significantly more likely to succeed academically. Transversely missing ONE or more days a fortnight has a very large impact on students success. For example of the Year 13 students last year whose attendance was below 85%, only 55% of those students passed their Level 3!!
