





What do students need to achieve <u>at school</u> to reach to their goals <u>beyond school</u>?



- UE standard is needed to start a degree course
- NCEA Level 2 is useful for many apprenticeships, and certificate or diploma courses
- Level 1 Literacy and/or Numeracy are helpful for some industries (e.g. some areas of the NZ defence force.)

### **UE literacy and Numeracy**

- Five Reading and Five writing credits at Level 2 or above
- Aim to complete in Year 12







There is NO extra numeracy requirement for UE standard.

#### **Academic English Language Requirement**

The University of Auckland (no other tertiary institutions!) requires 17cr in English at Level 2 or 3..... BUT

- You can still attend U of A if you have not yet achieved it.
- If you have not achieved it you will need to take an approved paper in your first year. This is NOT an extra paper.
- The 3ENU semester course is running in place of the study period to support students. See Ms Moss for more information.





### Beyond UE standard.

- Some university courses more than UE standard for admission.
- The University of Auckland are possibly the strictest
- Students need to aim for Merit; ideally Excellence



Guaranteed entry requirements
Engineering U of A:



- 17 external Level 3 credits in Calculus
- 16 external Level 3 credits in Physics



If you have concerns about what the engagement report is showing, please contact your child's Hui mai teacher or Dean in the first instance. More detailed information will be emailed home over the coming days.






