Please note that there is a new out of zone category for 2012 (*Fourth Priority: child of a former student of the school*).

Basketball Results

U15 Boys Basketball played Rutherford College last Thursday for 5^{th} and 6^{th} places. The game was tight and went into extra time and with a shootout to determine the winner. We won the shootout and won the game 39-38, finishing 5^{th} for the season.

U17 Boys played Massey in the grand final for 1st and 2nd places. Our boys were confident going into the game as they were undefeated during the season. It was a close game, but our boys were unlucky with a few calls and lost in the final moments 29-31 to Massey, finishing the season 2nd.

U19 Girls played in the grand final against Massey. It was unfortunate we were unable to field our strongest team due to injuries. However, the girls played extremely well with only 5 players for the entire game. Massey came away with the win 36-17 which had us finishing 2nd for the season.

Overall it was a successful season for Basketball this year, with three teams making grand finals and no teams finishing lower than 5th place in their respective competitions. Adding to that, the U17 Boys, U19 Boys and U19 Girls have all made the greater Auckland Basketball Tournament coming up in September. Only the top teams from Auckland make it through to this level.
