**Dear Parents/Caregivers** 

Welcome to the second newsletter for the year.

Our Year 9 students have settled well into their school life at Lynfield, with the majority making the most of the new opportunities that are available to them. I would encourage our junior students to become involved in some of the many extra-curricular activities offered at the College. This is a great way for students to develop pride and commitment to others within the school community. Students should read the daily notices during form time to keep informed about cultural and sporting opportunities that may arise. The daily notices are also posted on student noticeboards and on e-LynC.

Our Athletics Sports day was very successful. The House system encourages participation from all levels with some fierce competition in a variety of point-allocated events. From this day students were selected to take part in the College's Athletics Championships. Results from the days appear in the sports section of this newsletter.

An NCEA Parents' Evening will be held on Thursday 5 March at 7pm in the staffroom. I urge all parents who have students at NCEA level this year to attend the evening, to better equip them to monitor the development and opportunities of their sons and daughters. It is very useful for parents and staff to exchange ideas and learn from each other about how to enhance student learning.

On Wednesday 11 March a Whānau Hui will be held at the College Te Ringa Āwhina at 6.30pm, where we especially look forward to welcoming our new families to the school.

We are half way through Term 1 with teaching staff having undertaken assessment activities with all students. Progress Report writing has begun. These reports will indicate the academic progress, effort and organisation and lessons missed by students in each subject. As such they will provide an indication to you of how focused and settled your children are in their learning and where support is required. All families received a copy of the homework pamphlet with Newsletter No. 1. This is a guide on how you can help with homework and what the school's expectations are. ## **Progress Conferences**

Parents are asked, wherever possible, to attend the conferences on the day which corresponds with the first letter of the student's surname.

All parents/caregivers are expected to visit their child's teachers on one of these afternoons as it is a part of the school/home partnership so vital to a student's progress. Students are released at 2.20pm on these days and the HCD bus departs from Boundary Road at 2.30pm.

#### **Digital Devices at Home**

Recently the College has been approached by parents seeking advice on how to deal with students and their devices in the home, particularly late at night.

The issue is really one of communication and parenting within the home:

- Talk with your child about any concerns you have and why.
- Know what homework is being done on the device. See evidence of it.
- For juniors it would be very unusual for a student to need to be doing homework after 9pm.
- If online activities such as gaming are an issue, turn off the WiFi between certain times.
- Devices used at school need to be charged each night. Don't do this in their bedroom.
- You can always keep the device for times that you think are appropriate.

# PhotoLife Online Ordering System

The Lynfield College class photographs will be available for you to view and order online with PhotoLife Studios.

Your son or daughter will bring home an online slip with their unique Shoot Key detailed on it. This Shoot Key will automatically display your child's class photograph. It is then an easy process for you to shop online and purchase the photograph you want. The College will also receive a number of order envelopes for those of you who do not have access to the internet or do not wish to use this system.

If you place your order within two weeks of receiving your Shoot Key you will receive free delivery for your photo orders. PhotoLife has agreed to despatch all the orders back to the school and your child will bring the photographs home.

Any orders placed after this period will be sent directly to your specified delivery address and will incur a \$5.00 postage & packing charge. You will see this message when you go online to view and order your photographs.

# Team Talk

## Summer Sports

The 2015 summer season is well under way with approximately 230 students competing in regular weekly interschool team competitions in tennis, cricket, dragon boating, golf, orienteering, touch, and volleyball. We have more students involved in summer sport this year including a third boys' cricket team and a huge increase in orienteers.

Please remember, all team members are required to wear an appropriate sports uniform which the Sports Office will supply. **Please ensure the bond for sports uniforms is paid, in cash, to the Sports Office (NOT online).** Please pay your sports fees to the Sports office, accounts office or online.

## Tennis

As with most of our sports, we have some competitive and some social tennis teams. Consequently results are mixed but all are enjoying their sport. There have been some last minute venue changes which have led to some of our teams winning by default which is frustrating.

# Volleyball

Our senior girls' team remains undefeated in their competition! These girls have trained hard throughout the holidays and are focussed on success at the Auckland Secondary Schools Championships to be held at The Trusts stadium in 2 weeks (12 – 14 March).

The senior boys' team is performing well, winning the majority of their games and improving noticeably each game.

# Cricket

Our 1<sup>st</sup> XI has continued to perform well scoring 218-1 off 25 overs in a recent game against Rosmini College. Darshan Mehta scored 84 while Mohammad Sufi and Partiv Patel both scored more than 50 runs (58 and 51 respectively) not out. In reply, Rosmini were all out for 82 which gave Lynfield a win by 136 runs!!

The junior cricket team has played only one game so far. Lynfield batted first and scored 154-8 in 20 overs. Westlake was bowled out in the 17<sup>th</sup> over after scoring only 73 runs giving us a win by 81 runs!

A very keen group of seniors have formed a 2<sup>nd</sup> XI cricket team with Aakshay Chauhan, a former Dux Ludorum, as their coach. They have played two games and really enjoyed themselves and are the first to admit they need "a bit more practice"!

#### Golf

Our golf team of Shantael Ligaliga (Y12), Jocelyn Katu (Y13), Izzy Ligaliga (Y13) and Joseph Peteru (Y9) are in the 1<sup>st</sup> division for the 'all Auckland' competition. They had a great win over McLean's but, with only 3 of the team available (Jocelyn was competing in the nationals), narrowly lost to Kings last week.

Although ours is a mixed team (comprised of boys and girls), all the other teams in this division of the competition are boys only. Our opposition is learning not to take the talent of our girls lightly!

#### Orienteering

This year we have 27 students from all year levels enjoying this competition which is held on the grounds of a different school each week. Each competes individually to find all the check points in the fastest possible time. Due to a cloud burst, several did not finish the course in the allowed time the first week. However, last week was a different matter with Gianni Gambasi finishing 9<sup>th</sup> out of 25 in the senior boys, Amy Bernstone 12<sup>th</sup> out of 28 in the intermediate girls and Ella McKenzie 4<sup>th</sup> out of 13 in the junior girls. For several of our students competing, this is a new sport and the learning curve has been very steep and a lot of fun.

# Touch

Our Senior Boys and Senior Girls teams play each Tuesday at Cox's Bay reserve. They are both focussing on skill development and smart strategies on the field and their games are showing plenty of growth and are becoming very competitive very quickly! Both teams have had some wins and some losses.

#### Dragon boating

We now have 4 stable teams of 20 paddlers from all year levels. Two teams train at Westhaven on Tuesdays and two on Wednesdays. Every week the paddlers end up wet and grinning from ear to ear in this fun filled sport. The Auckland Secondary Schools Championships are now only three weeks away so the training intensity is increasing.

#### Winter Sports

Pre-season training for rugby and football is happening weekly. Musters and trials for other winter sports will take place over the next two weeks. These will be advertised in the Daily Notices.

Without your help to manage, coach or transport one of our teams this year, we definitely could not provide sporting opportunities to such a large number of students. Remember, to manage a team you do not need knowledge of the sport, just to be a channel for communication between coach and players as needed and help organise (not necessarily provide) transport to games. We will not enter a team into a competition unless it has both a coach and a manager!

#### Auckland Transport – Student Concession AT HOP card

Current secondary student concessions on AT HOP cards must be renewed by 31 March 2015. To load a concession on your AT HOP card follow the process below:

Step 1 – Buy an AT HOP card

Step 2 – Register your AT HOP card by visiting <u>AT.govt.nz/concessions</u> for instructions

Step 3 - Ensure you have proof of eligibility

#### Get an AT Student ID card from your school

Step 4 – Submit your concession application online:

- Login to your MyAT account and select 'Apply for a Concession' from the menu
- Confirm your details are correct
- Select the card you wish to apply the concession to and fill out the relevant eligibility details
- Click 'submit'

Step 5 – Load a concession on your AT HOP card

Visit your nearest AT Customer Service Centre to load a concession on your card. Remember to take your AT HOP card and Student ID card along.

Note: This process does not apply to Child Concessions for children aged 5 - 15 years.
