The Festival Awards Evening, held on Thursday 15 October at Eden Park, was a special occasion which recognised the efforts of students, parents, staff and members of the wider Lynfield community, who have contributed to the College extra-curricular activities in 2015. We celebrated the success of sporting, arts and cultural aspects of the College, with awards for outstanding achievement and contribution at the senior level. Congratulations to all those who have won awards, with particular mention of the following students who have achieved the supreme awards:

Dux Ludorum (Boys) - Cree Braithwaite

A talented all round athlete whose love of sport has been obvious since Year 9, Cree is a natural leader who has always chosen to lead by example. Sports played with an oval ball are his big passion. He has been a member of the 1st XV Rugby team for the past 3 years, is a representative Tag player and Captain of our Premier League team. As this year's make Sports Captain, Cree has organised House Competitions and assisted with the running of Athletics Day and the Road Race.

Dux Ludorum (Girls) - Akanesi Fakafanua

Akanesi is a very talented sportswoman who has made many significant contributions to Lynfield College sport. During her time at Lynfield, she has represented the school in the top basketball, volleyball and tag teams as well as Premier and UNISS Netball teams. Akanesi was a member of our very successful Senior Girls Volleyball team which won the Division 1, Central Auckland Competition and finished 12th in Greater Auckland. As the Assistant female Sports Captain this year she helped with the organisation of all House Competitions.

Dux Artium - Jake Krishnamurti

Jake is an outstanding musician who excels on trumpet, trombone and euphonium in both jazz and classical genres. He has been a member of the Concert Band, Big Band, Jazz Combo, Symphony Orchestra, Chamber Orchestra, Soul Jam and Production Band. In 2015, Jake was selected to play lead trumpet with the NZ Youth Jazz Orchestra (U20 years of age). He was Winner of Best Original Composition at NZ Youth Jazz Festival and Winner of Best Jazz Soloist at Auckland Jazz Band Competition. He plays with Queen City Big Band, and has already played a number of professional gigs on both trumpet and trombone. We are pleased to announce that Jake Krishnamurti is our Dux Artium for 2015.

Most Outstanding Sports Performance of the Year (Proctor Cup) - Maddison Wesche

This award is presented only if a student has performed at an exceptional level regionally or nationally. Maddison Wesche has certainly done this. Maddi is an extremely committed and talented, yet humble athlete who has chosen to focus specifically on one event – Shot Put. After taking up this discipline two years ago, she has excelled at all levels. In the past 12 months, Maddi has become the "golden girl" in NZ Youth Shot Put circles. Her results are truly outstanding:

- Won the Western Zone Intermediate Girls Shop Put, setting a new Auckland Secondary Schools record.
- At the Greater Auckland Athletics Intermediate Girls Shot Put, she broke her own record 3 times before winning the event with a record throw of 15.38m which was better than the winning senior throw.
- Won gold in Intermediate Girls Shop Put at the North Island Secondary Schools Champs, setting a new record (15.35m) which broke Valerie Adam's long-standing record for this event. Again, her throw was better than the winning senior!
- Maddi is the NZ Secondary Schools Junior Girls Shot Put Champion.
- Won gold in the Auckland Athletics Champs, again setting a new record and again, beating the seniors!
- Won gold in the U18 and Gold in the U20 Women's Shop Put at NZ National Athletics Champs.
- Won Gold in the U16 Shot Put at the Australian Athletics Champs.
- Was 1 of only 6 athletes selected to represent NZ in the World Youth (U18) Athletics Championships in Colombia, South America in July, finishing 17th in a field of 35.

Maddi epitomises the well-balanced high achiever and is an excellent role model in all she undertakes. We wish Maddi well when she represents Lynfield College in the NZ Secondary Schools Athletics Championships in early December.

At the end of each year Lynfield College runs a cross-curricular programme for our junior students. This is scheduled to take place after feedback on exams has been returned to the students. The theme is 'Caring for our Community' with both Year 9 and Year 10 students involved.

The aim of the C4C programme is to encourage the students to be actively involved in the community in which they live. 

Team Talk
