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## Dear Parents/Caregivers

We have a period of senior assessment in week 7, from Tuesday 2 to Friday 5 June. Senior students have been issued with timetables and exam instruction sheets. The timetable and examination instructions are currently on the student e-LynC site and on the College website, which parents can access. Any assessment clashes should have been reported to Mr Waddington, Academic Advisor by now and an alternative time during the week arranged. B3 will be a supervised study room.

If a student misses an exam because of illness or an emergency, the College must be contacted on the day of assessment, using the absence phone line (627 0600 option 1/extension 729) and leaving a message for the student's Dean. If the missed assessment is a final NCEA one, a doctor's certificate should also be given to Mr Black, Deputy Principal and arrangements made to sit the assessment before the end of the exam week.

Students in Years 9 and 10 have normal class timetables during the assessment days, although there will be some room changes they will need to follow from the daily notices each day (these are also on e-LynC and the school noticeboards). If you have any questions about assessment activities please contact Mr M Black through the school office.

Mid-year Reports are now being prepared and these will be issued on Thursday 2 July to senior and junior students. Progress Conference evenings will be held for students and their parents on Thursday 6 and Tuesday 11 August in Term 3. The time lapse between issuing reports and having progress conferences is deliberate. It gives students the opportunity to work on the advice offered in the subject reports and so improve their academic performance before receiving more feedback at the conferences.

At this time of the year colds and flu are on the increase. Students can take some simple precautions to reduce the impact of these illnesses on themselves and fellow students by wearing appropriate winter school uniform, having adequate wet weather protection and washing and drying their hands properly. Those who are not well should remain at home so that they can recover more quickly and not spread their illness.

If a student is on medication or has health issues which are likely to impact on any aspect of their schooling, parents/caregivers should directly contact our school nurse and discuss the situation with her. Our school nurse, Mrs Glynne Newton is available on 627 0600 extension 755. In an emergency, our nurse is likely to be the first medic on the scene. Nurse Newton also needs to be notified by a parent when a student requires medication during the day. All medicine required by a student during the school day must be stored in her office. Your child's Dean should also be notified. If a student feels unwell after arriving at school, then he or she should go and see the Nurse in the first instance, who will contact parents or caregivers.

Now that winter is here, we are in need of school jerseys and jackets to loan to students who for a number of reasons do not have them. If you would like to donate any uniform no longer required by your family we would appreciate having it. The uniform can be left at our reception desk.

## **NZQA Fees and Financial Assistance**

The 2015 NZQA fee for domestic students is \$76.70, with a maximum of \$200 per family.

**NB:** Previously, three Scholarship entries were included in this \$76.70 NCEA fee. This is no longer the case. NZQA now charges a \$30 per subject fee for Scholarship entries. Payment of the standard fee should be made as soon as possible. Invoices for the extra amount for Scholarship candidates will be issued later when Scholarship entries have been finalised.

The cost for International fee paying students is \$383.30. This does not include Scholarship entries, which are \$102.20 per subject. Financial assistance cannot be claimed for International fee paying students.

Financial assistance is available for those who meet one of the following criteria:

- currently receiving a Work and Income or Study Link benefit, or have a current Community Services Card (benefit-based applications)
- are not currently receiving a benefit, or do not have a current Community Services Card, but do have a joint family income that would entitle you to receive a Community Services Card (income-based applications)
- have two or more children who are candidates, irrespective of family income, and the total fees you would have to pay would otherwise be more than the \$200 multiple candidate maximum (multiple candidate applications).

The fee for those qualifying for financial assistance in the first three categories is \$20, with a maximum of \$30 per family.

You must fill in an application form to receive financial assistance.

A new application has to be filled in each year – if you received financial assistance last year it does not automatically carry over.

**Financial assistance application forms are now available from the Deans' Reception.** The form should be completed and returned to Mr Delgrosso's office as soon as possible. Students with a full fee invoice (\$76.70) should return it when they bring in their completed Financial Assistance form. A new invoice for the adjusted amount will be issued. The process can be shortened if the student brings in the \$20 fee when they return the completed Financial Assistance form.

Invoices have been issued to students, with payment due by the end of this term (3 July). Please plan for this payment so that you can help us to meet our NZQA deadlines. For most students, the fee will be \$76.70.

**NB:** The invoice should be returned to the Accounts Office when payment is made. If paying online, please also return the invoice. Write a brief note at the top of the invoice that payment has been made online, together with the date of payment.

Although the 1<sup>st</sup> XV Rugby lost their most recent game, they are showing excellent discipline, are really starting to think as a team and showing great improvement.



The **U15 Boys Basketball** team is coached by ex-student Cale Piritaie and has started the season with 4 wins and remain undefeated! These boys are extremely good listeners, committed and enthusiastic and this attitude is paying huge dividends.

This week students are beginning a sport never offered before at this school. We have 2 teams entered into a weekly interschool **Curling** competition which takes place on Thursday evenings at Paradice Ice Skating Rink. Curling is an Olympic sport which is played extensively in colder climates. It is so good to see our students prepared to learn new skills!

#### **Individual Honours**

**Michael Carswell (Y12)** finished 3rd in the U19 division of the Secondary Schools' North Harbour Cycling Tour last Saturday and Sunday. The tour consisted of 4 races over 2 days - 2 road races, 1 time trial and 1 criterium. This is an outstanding achievement as the competitors included the best U19 cyclists in Auckland.

**Samantha Martin (Y9)** has just returned from the North Island Secondary Schools Swimming Championships in Palmerston North. She competed in 4 events, finishing 2<sup>nd</sup> in the 200m Butterfly and in the top 8 for each of the other events.



**Juee Bhide (Y13, 2014)** has just been selected as a member of the NZ Junior Women's Squash team. She is ceded 3rd player in the team of 4 and will be travelling to the Netherlands in July for the World Junior Championships.

**Joshua Head (Y12)** has long had a passion for bikes and engines. He has raced successfully over the past 4 years and is now making his way into the world of adult motorbike racing. He writes:

"Currently where I am in my racing status, I competed in the New Zealand WIL sport Hyosung cup on 250 production race bikes (seen in photo) with riders considered exceptionally good, with a handful of them having been or are still successful competitors in Europe (World Championship). Out of a total of 36 top New Zealand riders (majority adults), I came away with many successful finishes including a finish on the podium. I was awarded the highest performing rookie also known as the new-comer cup and I am hoping in the near future to compete over in Europe which is the top step for motorcycle racing and an extremely difficult and demanding scene to do well in. Since the Hyosung cup has ended, winter will consist of a lot of training and time on the bike in preparation for the national championship, where I have big expectations of doing well to progress further towards my goal."
