Dear Parents/Caregivers

Term 3 has particular importance for senior student achievement. We have progress conference evenings on Thursday 11 and Tuesday 16 August from 4 - 7pm for all year levels. Students will be released at 2.20pm on those days. This is an opportunity to get feedback on your child's progress and find out what work may need to be done for successful results in the senior exams that begin in Week 7 of this term, running from Wednesday 7 to Friday 16 September. Further information is contained in this newsletter about booking interview times online.

Course Selection

Senior Course selection for 2017 began this week when Year 11 and 10 students were issued with a Senior Course Information booklet and the relevant course selection form. Next Monday Year 12 students will also be issued with a Senior Course Information booklet and the relevant course selection form. An electronic copy of the Senior Course Information booklet can be opened from the front page of e-LynC or from our website (http://www.lynfield.school.nz/Curriculum/Courses.html) Students will be briefed on the importance of making careful and informed choices and are encouraged to talk to their subject teachers about which courses to take. I would urge parents and caregivers to spend time discussing possible courses with their child, while being guided by the important qualifications, awards and prerequisite information contained in the Senior Course Information booklet. There will also be an opportunity to discuss the courses that students are best placed to take with the subject teachers at the Progress Conferences next Thursday 11 August and Tuesday 16 August.

Students are required to hand their completed course selection forms to their Form Teacher before **Monday 22 August**. Parents are encouraged to enter their child's selections on the Course Selection function of the Parent Portal. If you have been unable to do this, please indicate that on the form. We are using the two systems simultaneously this year, with the backup of a paper copy. The Course Selection function on the portal will open next week and close on Monday 22 August for these year levels.

On Wednesday 10 August, Year 9 will be issued with their Year 10 Course Information booklet and course selection form. Their selections should also be entered through the Parent Portal and the completed course selection forms should be handed to their Form Teachers by **Monday 29 August**, at which time the Course Selection function on the Parent Portal will close.

Student Leadership 2017 Elections

Next week, current Year 11 and Year 12 students who would like to be considered for a leadership position in 2017 will be invited to submit expression of interest forms to Deputy Principal Mrs Clark by Friday 12 August. Electronic speeches are due to Mrs Clark by Monday 22 August. Applicants' speeches and electronic voting will take place at the Year 12 and Year 11 assemblies in Week 9.

Speeches and voting for house captains will take place during House Meetings on Monday 17 October. Electronic speeches for house captain positions are due to Ms Walbran by Monday 22 August.

The Student Executive and House Captains for 2017 will be announced at 3.10pm on Friday 21 October. Student Executive positions are announced at the final Year 12 and Year 11 assemblies in Week 4, Term 4.

Student Representative, Board of Trustees 2016 - 2017

Students are invited to nominate themselves or another student to be the Student Representative on the Board of Trustees for 2016 – 2017. The role of the student representative is to provide input to the BOT, based on the perspectives of the students they represent. They can make valuable contributions to decisions that affect the strategic direction of the school.

Nomination forms and additional information are available from the Returning Officer, Mr Waddington. Nominations will close at noon on Friday 19 August and the election will be held on Tuesday 20 September. Results will be announced Monday 26 September.

NZQA

All students enrolled for Level 1, 2 and 3 NCEA will have received their details on a card this week. Please check the details on this card are correct and if there are any mistakes students are to go to Deans' reception to see Mr Delgrosso. Also students are encouraged to login to the NZQA website to check their entries. Here they will be able to see what external standards they are entered into for the exams at the end of the year. If there are any mistakes, students are encouraged to speak with their subject teacher in the first instance. **There can be no entries made after 1 September.**

Booking Parent Interview Times Online

Progress Conference evenings are to be held at Lynfield College on Thursday 11 August (A - L) and Tuesday 16 August (M - Z) from 4 – 7pm. On-line booking sheets were issued to all students with their Mid-Year Reports at the end of last term. These sheets should help you set the interview times with the teachers you wish to meet. On line bookings offer you as parents the opportunity to directly select the time at which you wish to meet teachers.

Access to the School Interviews website is through the internet using the URL address <u>http://www.schoolinterviews.co.nz</u> All students have been given written instructions on how to access the School Interviews website. Included with both this email and the information sheet is the special password for the Term 3 interviews – **tbqpb**. Use this to access the appointment booking sheet.

Once logged in, there are three simple steps to follow in order to complete the booking process. The information sheet given to students includes a printed copy of their courses and teachers' codes; this information is used to ensure you make interview times with the relevant staff. Parents should print out the email confirmation and bring it to the interview to enable the booking times to be followed.

Any parents unable to access the booking website should complete the manual booking slip on the instruction sheet and send this back to the school office with their child. Receptionist staff will also be able to make bookings through the school office number - phone 627 0600. The exact times for the interviews will be confirmed either by email or on the student's slip.

The New Zealand Blood Service (NZBS) will be collecting blood at the Lynfield College Hall Tuesday 9 August 2016, 9am to 2pm



Information for Whānau and Guardians

It is important that we encourage students into a lifetime habit of donating blood and making a worthwhile contribution to their community. The Care of Children Act 2004 allows people 16 years and over to make their own decisions about whether or not they wish to give blood. Students may choose to donate blood at this session.

NZBS recommends students discuss becoming a blood donor with their family. If families have a particular objection to the student choosing to donate blood, please make this known to the student and to the school before the collection date stated above. More information about blood donation will be available on the day of collection.

Becoming a Blood Donor...

Age: First Time Donors: 16 to 65 years of age Existing Donors: Up to 71 years of age

Weight: Weigh at least 50 kg

Health:

- You must be in good health.
- You cannot donate if you have a cold, flu, sore throat, cold sore, stomach bug or any other infection.
- If you have recently had a tattoo or body piercing you cannot donate for 6 months from the date of the procedure.
- If you have visited the dentist for a minor procedure you must wait 24 hours before donating; for major work wait a month.

Travel: You must not have lived in the United Kingdom, France or the Republic of Ireland between 1980 and 1996 for more than 6 months or received a blood transfusion in ANY of these countries since 1980.

Food: You must have eaten some food during the four hours prior to donation.

Identification: You must bring suitable identification with you. Acceptable ID is a document or combination of documents containing three (3) separate identifiers (e.g. NZBS Donor ID number, Full name, Photograph, Date of Birth, Home Address). A Student ID Card is acceptable if it features a photograph and two of the identifiers listed above. With your consent we may also ask the school to confirm you are at least 16 years of age.

Cup / Trophy Return

If you still have a cup or trophy at home which was awarded in 2015 (at Festival Awards, Senior or Junior prizegivings), please return them to the main reception in the Admin Building **as a matter of urgency**. It is NOT necessary to polish cups before their return. Thank you.


Pacific Homework Centre

Auckland Transport Simpler Fare System – starts for bus and train services on 14 August 2016 (excludes SkyBus)

Auckland Transport is introducing a new fare table and a new zone map with colour coded zones across Auckland. Using the table and map it is easy to work out your cash or AT HOP fare no matter which buses or trains you take. Visit AT.govt.nz/simplerfares

With an AT HOP card, you will pay for one entire journey from A to B, instead of paying for each bus or train separately. Tag on and off each bus and train as you do now and simply count the number of zones you travel through to work out your fare*. During your journey, you can use up to five buses or trains within four hours, with a maximum transfer time of 30 minutes between each trip.

New AT HOP child weekend fare

When using an AT HOP card with a child concession applied, pay a maximum one zone fare per journey on weekends and public holiday journeys no matter how many zones you travel through. A journey can comprise up to five buses or trains within four hours with a maximum transfer time of 30 minutes between each trip (excludes SkyBus services). The child one zone fare will be 99 cents from 14 August 2016.

*If you are travelling within a zone overlap area as part of a journey and paying with an AT HOP card (this means tagging on and off within the same zone overlap area) this may count as travelling through a new zone. From 14 August 2016 you can refer to our journey planner for the correct fare.
