Dear Parents/Caregivers

Thank you to the many parents and caregivers who attended the student progress conferences held during the past two weeks. More than 3,000 interview bookings were made over the two evenings, which ensured that valuable feedback on students' progress was gained by parents and teaching staff. Over the next two weeks senior students should follow through on any advice and revision guidelines recommended by their teachers to ensure success in the senior exams which begin in Week 7 of this term.

Many parents and students also took this opportunity to gain further information and advice on course selection for 2017. All Year 10 - 12 students have now been issued with the 2017 Senior Course Information booklet. Students who were absent at the time these booklets were distributed should see their Form Teachers. Please take time to discuss option choices and career paths with your children. It is essential that pages 2 - 10 of this booklet are read very carefully, particularly the course prerequisite and University Entry requirements, before making course selection decisions. Within these introductory pages are listed the school staff who are able to assist you in making these important decisions. A file copy of the Senior Course Information booklet can be opened from the front page of e-LynC or from the Curriculum section of our website.

Year 10 – 12 students are required to hand their completed course selection forms to their Form Teachers by **Monday 22** August.

Year 9 students have also been issued with their course selection information booklets for Year 10, 2017. Their completed course selection forms should be handed to their Form Teachers by **Monday 29 August**.

Parents are encouraged to enter their child's selections on the Parent Portal. If you have been unable to do this, please indicate that on the form. We are using the two systems simultaneously this year, with the backup of a paper copy.

Senior Assessment begins on Wednesday 7 September. A finalized timetable will shortly be made available to students and will be then put on the College website and e-LynC, with paper copies available at Deans' reception. It is important that students are fully prepared for these exams by:

- > Knowing their assessment timetable
- Seeing Mr Waddington, Academic Advisor as soon as possible if they have any clashes
- > Knowing what is being assessed and how
- Carefully reading the Examination Instructions for Students information
- > Having a study timetable and using the study leave from timetabled classes productively
- Students are to wear full and correct uniform at all times while at school

We have been advised by PPTA that there will be Paid Union Meeting on Monday 12 September. Senior exams will continue as scheduled. Junior students will be released at 12.30pm. The two Kiwi Coaches school bus runs will depart at 12.40pm (the Titirangi run from Boundary Road and the Mangere Bridge run from White Swan Road).

NZQA Fees for 2016

The deadline for payment to the school has been extended until Wednesday 31 August.

Full details of the NZQA fee are available on the College web site and in earlier Newsletters.

The College has its own deadlines to meet regarding the sending of the fees collected to NZQA.

Caregivers paying after 31 August must pay NZQA directly using the form available from the College or on the NZQA web site. The College will not accept NZQA fee payments after this date.

The deadline for payment of Scholarship fees to the school is Wednesday 14 September.

All students enrolled for Level 1, 2 and 3 NCEA will have received their details on a card. Please check the details on this card are correct and if there are any mistakes students are to go to Deans' reception to see Mr Delgrosso.

Also, students are encouraged to login to the NZQA website to check their entries. Here they will be able to see what external standards they are entered into for the exams at the end of the year. If there are any mistakes, students are encouraged to speak with their subject teacher in the first instance. **There can be no entries made after 1 September.**


Pacific Homework Centre
