Information from the Ministry of Education

Help with one-off uniform and stationery costs: Since 25 October, changes made to the Ministry of Social Development's online service MyMSD allow some MSD clients to apply online for assistance with school uniform and stationery costs.

Applicants can upload and send verification of the cost, in the form of a quote from the supplier. If the payment is approved, they will receive notification by text or email and the approved amount will be loaded to their payment card. The card can only be used for the amount and supplier for which it was approved.

Can you claim a tax credit for donations? If you have made a donation, you may be able to claim a tax credit. To be eligible, you need to have made a receipted donation of \$5 or more, e.g. to state schools, state integrated schools, other schools who have been approved as a done organisation, school boards of trustees or parent teacher associations.

Leavers' Day 2016

Leavers' Day on 5 December is <u>ONLY</u> for those who are leaving school. ALL leavers MUST return to school on 5 December to formally complete the leaving process.

Senior students who are returning next year received an individualised clearance form with their school report. They can complete their clearance obligations any time and from 28 November can take their completed Clearance Forms to their Dean at Interval or Lunchtime to receive their yearbook. If they have lost their individualised form they should see Mr Waddington, Academic Advisor, for a replacement.

We recommend that students return their text books to the Library on the last day of their examinations.

Year 13 students will complete Leavers' Day as in previous years, <u>reporting to the school Hall at 9 am on 5 December</u> to return their completed clearance form, then receive their Yearbook and Leaving Certificate.

If Year 13 students lose their individualised clearance form, they should see Mr Waddington, Academic Advisor for a replacement.

Year 9 and Year 10 - Caring for our Community (C4C) Programme, Thursday 1 & Friday 2 December

At the end of each year Lynfield College runs a cross-curricular programme for our junior students. This is scheduled to take place after feedback on exams has been returned to the students. The theme is 'Caring for our Community' with both Year 9 and Year 10 students involved.

The aim of the C4C programme is to encourage the students to be actively involved in the community in which they live. This is a good opportunity to encourage them to look at the world from another point of view and to look beyond themselves. Doing something for someone else is a way of achieving this. This supports many of the principles, values and key competencies of the New Zealand curriculum, including community engagement, integrity, participating and contributing and relating to others.

The normal school timetable will not run on these days as ALL students and ALL teaching staff will be involved in the workshops. Approximately 30 different workshops will be offered to the students.

We are excited about the enthusiastic response that we have already received from the community groups we will be working with and look forward to having a focus on 'giving to others' at this time of the year.
