Dear Parents/Caregivers

An invitation is extended to students, families and the local community to join us in celebrating the cultural diversity of our College tomorrow **Saturday 2 April**. There will be a variety of cultural performances to view and ethnic foods to purchase. The day will run from 12.00 until 4.00pm.

Progress Reports were issued on Wednesday 23 March, along with an individualised information sheet about our on line appointment booking schedule for progress conferences. The booking schedule will close at 9am on Thursday 7 April and will reopen the next day for further bookings for Tuesday 12 April. Parents are asked, wherever possible, to attend the conferences on the day which corresponds with the first letter of the student's surname.

All parents/caregivers are expected to visit their child's teachers on one of these afternoons as it is a part of the school/home partnership so vital to a student's progress. Students are released at 2.20pm on these days and the HCD bus departs from Boundary Road at 2.30pm.

The Board of Trustees has agreed to enrol categories 2, 3, 4 & 5 out of zone applicants for Year 9/2017. This means brothers/sisters of current and past pupils may enrol at the same time as in zone students from 2 August.

Construction on the re-development of the music area at the front of the school is progressing well. It should be completed in late July. As of this Monday, the hall is being refurbished. It will be out of action for all of April and May.

A perfect attendance record is a basic requirement for educational success. This includes arriving on time. There is a small number of senior students arriving late. Parents need to ensure that their sons/daughters leave in plenty of time so that they arrive at school before 8.40am each day.

Lynfield College Results – ASH Year 10 Snapshot 2015

Ongoing participation by our school has greatly contributed to understanding NZ youth smoking attitudes and behaviours. We have also helped to inform effective tobacco control measures which have considerably reduced smoking rates in the last decade. The table below shows the smoking trends for Lynfield College's Year 10 students in 2015. The national data for Year 10 smoking rates is also included as a comparison.

PhotoLife Online Ordering System

It is then an easy process for you to shop online and purchase the photograph you want. If you place your order within two weeks of receiving your Shoot Key you will receive free delivery for your photo orders. PhotoLife has agreed to despatch all the orders back to the school and your child will bring the photographs home.


Homework Centres

Greater Auckland Secondary Schools Athletics Championships

Competition was (predictably) very tough! In the Intermediate Boys 200m, 0.28sec separated 4 runners! Our athletes performed very creditably in this prestigious event.

Maddi Wesche again wowed the crowds as she broke the Auckland record with a Personal Best throw of 16.01m in wet, very windy conditions.

This Saturday Maddi will compete in the North Island Secondary Schools Athletics Championships at Mt Smart stadium. We wish her well for this competition.
