Dear Parents/Caregivers

## NZ Olympian visits Lynfield College

As a result of a Pita Pit competition entry by staff member, Holly Abraham, we were fortunate to have canoeist Lisa Carrington visit. Lisa is the only female in NZ Olympic history to win 2 golds at the same Olympics (Rio in 2016) and she has also won a bronze at both the London and Rio Olympics.

Lisa was welcomed to our school with a pōwhiri then met with Year 12 Sports Studies students and a small group of our most talented sportspeople for a relaxed, yet really interesting and informative question and answer session. This was followed by some kai provided by Lisa's sponsors, Pita Pit.



### Students Leaving School for Appointments

Students are encouraged to make appointments outside of school hours. However, if a student must leave school during the day:

- they are expected to bring a note from home on the day of the appointment,
- have the note signed by a Dean as soon as they arrive at school,
- present the note to their subject teacher when they leave class,
- present the note and then sign out at Deans' Reception where they will receive an 'Exit' slip.

We appreciate parent/caregiver support of this process.

## Lockdown / Evacuation Procedures at the College

Lynfield College engages the services of an independent company, Harrison Tew®, who specialise in emergency management planning for schools. The procedures developed allow us to respond safely and quickly to a range of circumstances.

As a component of the implementation of the emergency procedures in our school, specialised training is conducted with senior management and our staff. The students also receive training from Harrison Tew®, directed at their respective age groups during year level assemblies.

The training consists of a low key but detailed approach to potential threats and has been successfully implemented in hundreds of schools throughout New Zealand.

After the training, we will be conducting a lockdown exercise under the guidance and support of Harrison Tew®. The lockdown exercise will be on **Monday 19 March**.

The exercise will be as real-life as possible, which will mean that parents/families will receive notification by way of text and/or email. The notification will emphasise that this is an exercise/practice and will explain that all updated information will then be posted on the school website.

Prior to this occurring, can I please remind all parents and caregivers to ensure your contact details (mobile phone numbers and email addresses) are current as this will be our communication with you, should an emergency occur at the school.

In a genuine incident, should you hear of a lock down or evacuation at the school, can I please ask that you do not attend the school or phone, as we will not be able to respond. Your presence at, or contact with the school may make it more difficult for us to manage the situation and could potentially place your children and in fact yourselves at risk.
