

Measles

In light of the current outbreak of measles experienced in Auckland, we contacted parents over the weekend of students for whom we do not have evidence of their child having had MMR vaccinations. Thank you to those who have now emailed evidence of this to the school (admin@lynfield.school.nz). This evidence can be in the form of a photo or photocopy of the original MMR vaccination certificate itself OR a printout from your doctor. The information will be added to your child's enrolment information. If you did not receive an email, then we have confirmation of MMR vaccination in your child's records. Uniform

This past week, we have been putting a real focus on uniform and making sure students are respecting our uniform policy and always wearing it correctly. In particular, there has been a focus on non-uniform hoodies and jumpers. We would really appreciate your support with this in helping to ensure that all students are in the correct uniform, including on their way to and from school.

Cancer Awareness Week

Our Student Executive-organised Cancer Awareness Week included a mufti day on Wednesday 28 August and Shave for a Cure event on Daffodil Day, Friday 30 August. One staff member and 7 students braved the winter temperatures to have their heads shaved for a good cause. It was a fantastic effort by all who participated and together with funds raised from mufti day, students and staff raised \$1,867.30 cancer research.

Contacting students during school hours

Visitors to the College are required register at the main reception desk upon entering the school grounds. This is for the safety and wellbeing of all students and staff. If parents/caregivers need to see their child urgently during the school day, please contact the school office, either in person or by phoning 627 0600.

If students have external appointments during school time, they must bring a note from home and have it signed by a Dean when they arrive at school. Sign out must be completed before leaving the school grounds for appointments.

If a student is unwell, they should report in the first instance to the school nurse, who will assess their condition and if necessary make contact with parents/caregivers to arrange for the student to be signed out and taken home.

Student Leader Profile - Student Representative Board of Trustees

What an interesting year it has been! I came into the role expecting to generate transformative change for the student body. I came out of it with a much greater understanding and appreciation of the founding relationships and principles that act to guide the school forward and I am grateful to have had this opportunity this year.

Stepping into the role as the student representative on the board of trustees provided me with a very different perspective about how the school *really* functions. While previously I and other students have looked at the very near future – as we should, given our short 'stay' at Lynfield, the objectives the board sets is a whole lot further away. While students from each cohort leave, the school has to keep moving and plan for the future, to ensure the high standard of education Lynfield provides, continues. That is just the reality of it, and it's something I didn't fully appreciate until I sat in a position of governance where often, we looked 5 years, 10 years and even 20+ years ahead into the future.

That isn't to say the board doesn't care about the present. Quite the opposite. Just in the past year, I've had the opportunity to sit in deputy principal appointment interviews, ensuring that student voice is heard when looking to new leaders within our school. I've observed and reported in monthly BOT meetings, placed faculty achievement reports under scrutiny, and witnessed a large board membership transition where 4 of the 5 elected parent representatives for the 2019–2022 term are new to our Lynfield's board. 2019 has been a tremendous period of change, and I'm glad to have left my own mark in Lynfield College's new chapter.

As a student leader, I also have a role to play within the school's student leadership team. I've had the chance to work alongside some other like-minded, passionate students across the spectrum of year levels, who all really want to see the school succeed and for students to enjoy their five years of high school. Proactiveness and agency in the junior school has been promising. The future is in good hands.

SENIOR ASSESSMENT Wednesday 11 - Friday 20 September

All senior students (Year 11 - 13) will have exams and or workshops to attend during this assessment time. These will include internal assessments, opportunities to complete portfolio-based work or practice for the external NCEA exams. It is important that all senior students attend these workshops/exams. If for any reason a student is unable to attend the end of year NCEA External Examinations, their grade from the practice external exams could potentially be used as a derived grade.

The morning assessment time slot starts at 8.40am and the afternoon time slot starts at 1.00pm. When students do not have an assessment or workshop, they are encouraged to not be at school. There will be two study rooms available (B3 and L1) if needed.

Should your son/daughter not be able to attend one of their timetabled assessments, for sickness or other reasons, please ring the College absence line before their assessment starts.

The exam timetable and instructions have been issued to students via Schoology and is on the website. A paper copy has also been issued.


It is important that students are fully prepared for these exams by:

- > Students are to wear full and correct uniform at all times while at school
- > Students must bring their NSN card as a form of ID (these are being issued this week)

Fairtrade Week Activities

As part of Year 10 Social Studies internal assessment, a group of students looked at the human rights and environmental issues in the chocolate industry, holding a range of fun lunchtime activities in Week 4, to challenge student's knowledge and raise awareness of the industry.

In support of Fairtrade Fortnight, students fundraised for Oxfam, including a staff morning tea in return for donations. The students raised over \$1,000 in total, with \$197 of that coming from the morning tea. All money raised was donated to Oxfam.





ASD Impromptu Cup Tournament

Five Lynfield teams competed at the Auckland Schools' Debating North Island Impromptu Cup at Westlake on Saturday 10 August. Kyus Rodger and Joseph Hisayasu headed up the senior team with the others being largely Year 11 Debaters. The Impromptu Cup format is particularly challenging in that teams of two have only five minutes to prepare 5-minute speeches (6 minutes in the final rounds) on a range of topics.

At the end of FIVE rounds on Saturday, only one of our teams (Kyus and Joseph) made the top 16 (breaking in 3rd place, with the highest Speaker point total) and advanced to the Octofinals on Sunday. Kyus and Joseph did incredibly well, winning the Octofinal against Westlake Girls 2, their Quarterfinal against Westlake Boys 2, and, in a huge upset, their semi-final against Westlake Boys 1. This put them in the Grand Final of what is a very competitive tournament with 61 teams from across the North Island.

Grand Final Result

The Grand Final against St Cuthbert's College was an extremely lively event with an 11 adjudicator panel and nearly full lecture hall at Auckland University. The moot was "This house, as a species, would prefer to go extinct than be commercially farmed". Lynfield Affirmed the moot running a case that was largely built on the philosophical premise that only a life where one has self-determination, free-will and family bonds was worth pursuing, taking their side to win the final.


