# **NZ Secondary Schools Winter Tournament Week**

The winter sports season wrapped up with NZSS Tournament Week (2 – 6 September). This year 10 Lynfield teams competed in various tournaments, playing schools from all over NZ. 1st XI Girls Hockey and 2nd XI Boys Football competed in NZSS tournaments for the first time.

The experience for the players is far greater than just the time actually playing the games. It is a unique and invaluable opportunity for many of our best sportspeople to be part of the intensity of a top-level competition, day in, day out for a week and also to share the highs, lows and fun with other like-minded players and school mates. There were several Y9 and Y10 students in our teams which sets us up well for the future.

Every one of our players represented our school with pride and determination to give their best 100% of the time they were on the field/court/turf/ice. Every one of our teams learned so much - about their skill sets, game play and themselves.

Very special thanks to all the coaches and other adults involved. Without these dedicated people, our teams would never have had this experience. Then there were the supporters who travelled (100s of km in some cases) to watch and support from the sideline...thank you so much – the players and coaches really appreciated it.

Congratulations to all our players who represented Lynfield with pride and passion, playing hard but fair. This year's game results were:

Mixed Curling - 1st in North Island Secondary Schools champs

Girls Curling - 2<sup>nd</sup> in North Island Secondary Schools champs

1st XI Girls Football - 11th in "Kathy Seaward" tournament (18 teams competed at Whangarei)

1st XI Boys Football - 9th in "Trident" tournament (24 teams competed in Wanganui)

2<sup>nd</sup> XI Boys Football - 8<sup>th</sup> in 2<sup>nd</sup> XI Football tournament++ (16 teams competed in New Plymouth)

1st XI Boys Hockey - 7th in "Olympic Stick" tournament (12 teams competed in Pukekohe)

1st XI Girls Hockey - 10th in "Rosemary O'Brien" tournament (10 teams competed in Levin)

The end of term three doesn't mean end of sporting opportunities for the students here at Lynfield College. Recently, the sports council have been developing some exciting events for all students to get involved in.

With Pilates (Monday), Taekwondo (Wednesday) and Football (Friday) continuing to happen, we also have new sports such as cheerleading, indoor bowls and ultimate frisbee being introduced. There is a free trial session of cheerleading held here at school on Friday 20 September. Furthermore, there is three days of open indoor bowls training for all students on 24, 25 and 26 September, with a school championships being held on the first Friday of term four for anyone keen on giving this new sport a go. We are excited also to be sending a junior ultimate frisbee team to the Auckland championship in term four too.

To end term three, a teachers vs students game of volleyball will take place in the Lower Gym on the last Friday of the term.

Looking ahead to Term 4, a senior softball competition will be run during Week 1 and also the school will be entering mixed teams into an Auckland indoor netball competition.

For junior students as well, there are the usual summer sports which are softball, volleyball, cricket, water polo and touch – and as always, anything which the students are prepared and keen on getting involved in!
