Dear Parents/Caregivers

Lynfield College has experienced a Week of Solidarity for Christchurch and our Muslim community with student-led activities. Both students and staff wanted to assure our community that the College promotes and upholds a safe, caring, positive environment.

Blue ribbons were handed out at the school gates throughout the week (representing peace, harmony, unity and trust); there was a memorial site where College members could leave flowers, messages and chalk drawings of sympathy and support; there was a haka for our Muslim students and one-minute silence at each of the year level assemblies. Two fundraising events, a staff vs students football match and a blue-themed mufti day, raised over \$3,000 for the Christchurch appeal. On Friday 22 March, we held a memorial service on the field, with interdenominational prayers and karakia and two-minutes silence at 1.45pm.

We can all feel very proud of how our students have expressed the manaakitanga and whanaungatanga of Lynfield College.

Uniform

As we near the end of Term 1 and the warm summer days, families are reminded to have your child in full and correct school uniform in anticipation for the cooler months in Term 2.

This means wearing the school green jersey, black wet weather jacket or the black polyester jacket that are currently available in the school shop. Shoes must be all black leather-type, low cut (under the ankle) that covers the entire foot. Absolutely no boots, canvas or sandals.

Please also name your child's uniform and sports gear. The PE faculty have a lot of un-named lost property, because students are not naming their gear. Please make this a priority before Term 2.

Finally, in line with our country's desire to be plastic free, please bring your own bags when purchasing items from the school shop.

We appreciate your continued support in making sure your child is in correct school uniform and will continue to uphold these standards. Your support ensures that our focus remains on teaching and learning, and the best possible learning outcomes for your child.

2019 NZQA Fees and Financial Assistance

NZQA fees are now appearing on the portal and can be paid by credit card online or by Direct Credit into the school's bank account with your student's ID as a reference. Paper invoices will be issued early next term.

The fees should be paid by 6 July, the end of Term 2.

NB: The NZQA fee is a flat fee to cover all entries, regardless of how many/few there are. Adding or removing entries for standards during the year will not alter the fee.

The fee for a domestic student is \$76.70. For an international student it is \$383.30. Scholarship entries cost \$30 per subject for domestic students and \$102.20 per subject for international students. Scholarship entries will be decided later in the year when student progress has been more completely assessed. Please DO NOT pay for Scholarship entries until you have been invoiced for them. They will be reflected in an adjustment to the NZQA fee.

To apply for financial assistance, a form must be completed. If you received financial assistance last year, it does not automatically carry over. A new application form must be completed each year.

Financial assistance application forms should be returned to Mr Delgrosso or the Deans' Secretary.

To be eligible to apply for financial assistance you must be the fee-payer (usually the Parent/Caregiver) and meet at least one of the following criteria:

- Be currently receiving a Work and Income or Study Link benefit, or have a current Community Services Card (known as "benefit-based" applications).
- Are not currently receiving a benefit, or do not have a current Community Services Card, but do have a joint family income that would entitle you to receive a Community Services Card (known as "income-based" applications).
- Have two or more children who are candidates, irrespective of family income, and the total fees you would have to pay
 would otherwise be more than the \$200 (known as "multiple candidate" applications). [In effect, this means three or more
 children who are candidates, as two candidates generate combined fees of \$153.40, which is below the \$200 threshold. If
 Scholarship entries are involved, the fees for two candidates may exceed \$200.]

Financial assistance reduces the fee to \$20 per candidate or \$30 per family. This fee also covers Scholarship entries.

Once a Financial Application form has been processed by the school, the NZQA fee will be updated on the portal. It is very helpful if the \$20 (or \$30) fee is brought to school when the application form is returned. In this way, we are able to process the updating of the fee and the payment at the same time.

Our school tennis championships are being held next Friday. Results will be in the next newsletter.


NZSS Tennis Champs

We had 3 crews (each of 20 paddlers and a caller) involved – 1 girls' and 2 mixed teams. They all had a fantastic day with each team competing in 3 500m races and 3 200m races. "Lynfield Fury" (mixed) came home with **bronze** medals for the 200m and 500m.

We were also able to enter a mixed team in the Open 200m and 500m races. This team was largely Fury but with a few swapped in from our other crews. This team just missed out on medals, finishing 4th in both races – 0.03s and 0.06s behind the 3rd placed boat!! Uniform return

Payment of sports fees and uniform bonds can be made at the Accounts Office, Sports Office (which both have eftpos facilities available) or online.

Most trials are now complete and teams named. Final trials are taking place next week for winter sports and team selections posted on the Sports Office noticeboard. *Once students have been placed in a team they must meet all training and game commitments, as well as pay their fees to secure their place in the team.* All students in sports teams will take home a letter containing important information (e.g. playing dates, venues, costs) soon after selection. In fairness to all involved, all fees must be paid prior to the first game of the season, as per our NO PAY = NO PLAY policy.
