Parents are encouraged to enter their child's selections on the Course Selection function of the Parent Portal, which is now open. If you have been unable to do this, please indicate that on the form. We use the two systems simultaneously, with the backup of a paper copy. The Course Selection function on the portal will close on this due date. Login and password information was sent by email after the senior course information booklets were issued.

Progress Conference Evenings

Thank you to those parents/caregivers who attended our first evening of progress conferences last Thursday. The booking schedule re-opened at 9am on Friday morning for those parents who have not yet booked for **Tuesday 20 August from 4 – 7pm**. The portal will close at 9am Tuesday 20 August. This is an opportunity to get feedback on your child's progress and find out what work may need to be done for successful results in the senior exams that begin in Week 8 of this term, Wednesday 11 to Friday 20 September.

ALL students will be released at 2.20pm on both these days. The Mangere Bridge bus will depart at 2.30pm, but the Titirangi bus will depart at the usual time of 3.20pm. The College Library is open until 3.40pm for study purposes, for those students waiting for transport.

SENIOR ASSESSMENT

Wednesday 11 - Friday 20 September

All senior students (Year 11 - 13) will have exams and or workshops to attend during this assessment time. These will include internal assessments, opportunities to complete portfolio-based work or practice for the external NCEA exams. It is important that all senior students attend these workshops/exams. If for any reason a student is unable to attend the end of year NCEA External Examinations, their grade from the practice external exams could potentially be used as a derived grade.

The morning assessment time slot starts at 8.40am and the afternoon time slot starts at 1.00pm. When students do not have an assessment or workshop, they are encouraged to not be at school. There will be two study rooms available (B3 and L1) if needed.

Should your son/daughter not be able to attend one of their timetabled assessments, for sickness or other reasons, please ring the College absence line before their assessment starts.

A finalized exam timetable will be made available to students via Schoology in Week 6 and they will be issued with paper copies at form time. It will also be available on the website.

It is important that students are fully prepared for these exams by:

- Knowing their assessment timetable
- Seeing Ms Ram (E block) as soon as possible if they have any clashes
- Knowing what is being assessed and how
- Carefully reading the Examination Instructions for Students information
- Having a study timetable and using the study leave from timetabled classes productively
- Students are to wear full and correct uniform at all times while at school
- Students must bring their NSN card as a form of ID (these will be issued just before assessment week)
