Kia ora koutou

It was a pleasure to welcome back our students for their final term in 2020, especially as we are at Alert Level 1. The next 8 - 9 weeks are packed full of events as we try to make the best of what has been a complicated year for us all. We look forward to being able to speak with more of our Lynfield community in person over this time.

We hope all our students enjoyed the two-week holiday break. For those of us still onsite it was a particularly busy time as we undertook a major network and photocopier upgrade across the campus. Should you experience any difficulties in accessing the parent portal please email your child's Dean.

Our Korowai Value for Term 4 is Hinengaro Wawata

The first two weeks have a focus on 'we are creative'. This was celebrated with energy and colour with **Pink Shirt Day** with students and staff fully involved in supporting the message '**Kōrero Mai, Kōrero Atu. Mauri Tū, Mauri Ora. Whakaweto te Whakaweti!** (Speak up and speak out. Stand together in life and wellness. Put an end to bullying). Our students' response to this multi day saw donations reaching a total \$1,105.00. This 'creative' theme will continue with next week's auditions for our Talent Quest.

We have been working with traffic engineers from Auckland Council over the past few years to see if the traffic flow around the College can be improved. Health and safety concerns, culminating in a Fire and Emergency appliance being unable to access our buildings due to onsite congestion when responding to an alarm activation at the end of the school day, has meant that student drop-offs and pick-ups will continue to be off the school grounds.

The School Board has made considerable investment into property including shade covers, upgraded sports fields and all-weather turf. To secure and protect our facilities for our students and the community to enjoy, permanent gates will be installed at Gates 1 and 2. In the interim the temporary tape and cone barriers will remain in place until this project has been completed.

This year we have seen a 20% drop in those paying the general purpose donation. For those who have continued to make this donation we appreciate your continued support. Next year the Board of Trustees will trial the School Donation Scheme. This will be reviewed at the end of the year to determine the impact on our Teaching and Learning programmes and the range of learning opportunities offered.
