Welcoming those new to our school and those returning was the focus for our first week back at school.

Starting with a pōwhiri for our new staff this was followed by a pōwhiri for our Year 9 students and their whānau. Our school hall was overflowing. It was a real pleasure to be able to speak with a number of parents afterwards. We missed not being able to meet with you face-to-face for enrolment interviews in 2020 due to Covid.

It was also a real pleasure to meet all the Year 9 students, in form class groups, during their Orientation Programme. I shared what we value at Lynfield College and some of the history of our school with them. The number of students who have had a parent or grandparent previously attend Lynfield seems to increase each year!

The other year levels were welcomed by their Dean and form teachers with students now having confirmed their learning programmes for 2021. The happy and excited buzz of our students upon their return has set a positive tone for the year. We extend a particularly warm welcome to those students joining us for the first time in 2021.

Friday saw the whole school on normal timetable with students showing manaakitanga in helping each other find where they were supposed to be. Due to the refurbished F Block classes not all being released for use until later in the month some room changes were needed.

2021 will be a year of Design and Construction at Lynfield.

Design:

- for the new 30 teaching space block with Brewer Davidson, Architects, being appointed by the MOE at the end of 2020.
- as we further progress our own localised curriculum.

Construction:

- there has been considerable building work around the school over the holiday break. In addition to the refurbished F
 Block, air-conditioning is being installed in G Block classrooms and the turf replaced in 2020 has been protected with
 new fencing.
- Further construction work has now begun to address watertightness issues at the front of the Library and Lower Gym. Students are reminded not to enter the signed construction zones.
- The asphalt courts are scheduled to be resurfaced and the school gates installed by the end of the term.

I look forward to meeting with more of our whānau as the year gets underway.

NCEA RESULTS 2020

Despite the challenges and disruption to learning due to Covid19 in 2020, our Year 11,12 and 13 students achieved some very pleasing results for NCEA.

Highlights:

Year 11: 78.4% gained L1 certificate. Of these 31.9% had their level certificate endorsed with Excellence and 30.7% endorsed with Merit.

Year 12: 83.6% gained L2 certificate. Of these 16.5% had their level certificate endorsed with Excellence and 31.7% endorsed with Merit.

Year 13: 81.6% gained L3 certificate and 61.4% gained UE, which is above the national statistics of 51.7%. Of those receiving their L3 certificate 17.8% were endorsed with Excellence and 23.6% at Merit.

A student can now only be offered a resubmission opportunity when a minor error prevents them reaching an 'Achieved' grade. This means the highest grade that can be awarded for a resubmission of an internal standard is Achieved'.

LEARNING SUPPORT NEW STAFF

Lynfield's Learning Support Department staff all attended professional development last Wednesday at Waikowhai Primary. The RTLB service combined with the Ministry of Education to facilitate workshops aimed at fostering inclusive learning. Topics included plugging literacy and mathematic gaps, understanding ASD, ADHD and Dyslexia and ways to enhance social and emotional wellbeing. The afternoon featured a presentation on Trauma informed schools which was presented by Debbie Watkin, psychologist and Allie Fyfe, nurse specialist. Feedback from the Learning Support Department was very positive.

BYOD AT LYNFIELD 2021

Lynfield College is a Bring your Own Device (BYOD) school. Every student is required to have a suitable device for learning that they can bring to school every day.

That means that all of our courses at every level have an online component and devices are used by students on a daily basis to access learning activities and resources. It also provides us with the ability to switch from 'face-to-face learning' to 'learning from home' should we have to enter lockdown again.

There are a range of suitable devices available from a number of different retailers. The basic recommendations can be found on our website: https://www.lynfield.school.nz/Curriculum/e-Learning.html

If you are struggling financially to provide a device for your child(ren) we can arrange for them to loan a device from the school with a \$30 deposit for one device, \$50 for two and \$70 for three or more from the same immediate family. This will involve your child picking up an agreement form from the library or front office to take home for you to sign and returning this form to the accounts office with the deposit. This is a refundable deposit should the device(s) be returned in full working order.

The school aims to support all students to have access to a device but we will only be able to loan devices where there is family hardship. That way we can use our limited resources to supply those students in genuine need.
