Kia ora koutou

One of the highlights of my position as Tumuaki is receiving positive feedback from members of our community.

Two recent examples of this have been related to our students demonstrating whanaungatanga tika, we are caring and active in our community.

The first example was one of our students who assisted a 5 year old in Kimber Hall Ave after school (post from the Lynfield Community page follows below) and the second was a student who stopped his car to move a fallen tree that was blocking traffic. We hope that the families of these boys are aware of their actions and how much they have been appreciated.

In contrast to this we are having to remind our students at assemblies of situations where our school values have not been demonstrated and situations where students are not following school rules. These include:

- Public displays of both 'affection' and 'aggression'. For the emotional and physical safety of our students this is a 'no touching school'.
- Vaping - under the 'Smokefree Environments and Regulated Products Act' schools are required to be both smoke and vape free.
- Cellphones - these are to be switched off and in bags / pockets for each lesson. They are to only be brought out by invitation of the teacher, should their use support learning (e.g. photographing a completed product for a portfolio).

Unfortunately, a number of discipline responses have been required recently as a consequence of the unsafe decisions some of our students are making. We would appreciate your support in ensuring your child is aware of their responsibilities here.

Students answered a staggering 381,321 questions over the course of the competition and came 1st in New Zealand for Chinese, 2nd in German and 19th in Japanese. Following some encouraging words by our school principal, Cath Knell, the students indulged themselves in some well-deserved food which was sponsored by the Education Perfect Team.

Our international language teachers, Heike Zimmer (German), Jay Kim (Japanese) and Judy Fang (Chinese) have made a great contribution to the success of our students. We are now looking forward to the challenge of next year's World Championships and hope to improve further on the success of this year.

And remember we really look forward to receiving submissions in te reo māori.

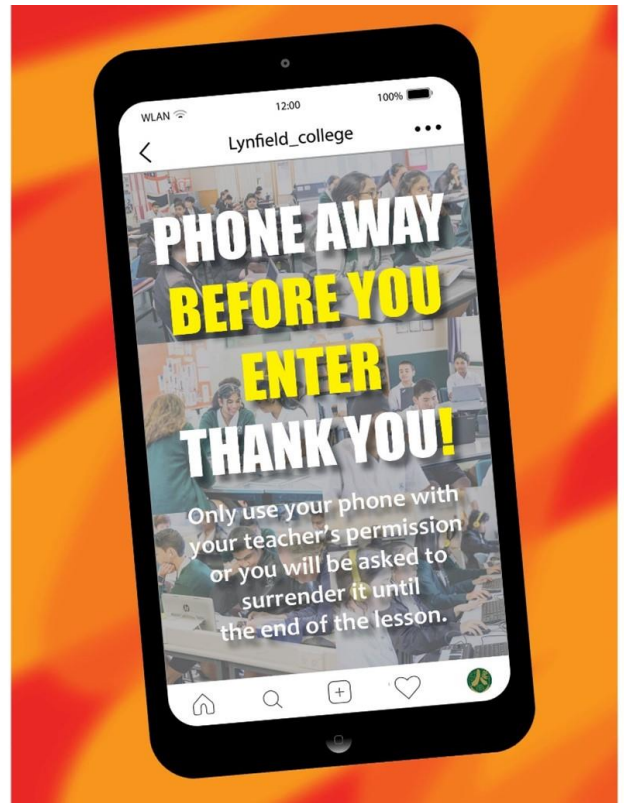
