We welcomed our students back to school after the holidays with a focus on hinengaro wawata 'we are ambitious'. Past and present students who are currently demonstrating this have been celebrated at this week's assemblies. Some of these are featured in this newsletter.

With the focus currently being on the Olympics we are following these **four Olympians** - all are past pupils of Lynfield College: **Katie Bowen**, Football; **Eroni Leilua**, Sailing; **Tyla Nathan Wong**, Women's Rugby Sevens and **Maddi Wesche**, Shot-put. Another past pupil currently in Tokyo at the Olympics is Dr Carl Bradford, Sport Scientist with the NZ Women's Track Endurance Squad. The last of the Olympians with links to Lynfield College is Dylan Schmidt, Trampolining. Dylan has volunteered with our Learning Support students with his mother having worked in this department. All of these have demonstrated through their hard work, commitment and sacrifice, the school value of hinengaro wawata.

In 2020 the Board of Trustees introduced a new scholarship - The Sports or Creative, Innovative Scholarship which comes with a financial reward. Students eligible to apply for these must represent in their chosen activity (sport or creative, innovative) at a regional, national or international level. The first successful applicants for 2021 are Daisy Chen (10JP) who plays 1st violin in the Auckland Youth Orchestra and Stanley Long (12RY) who was recently selected to play in four international tennis tournaments. There will be a further round of scholarships offered later this term.

After 23 years at Lynfield College, of which 19 years were as a Dean, Mrs Sofia Hameed was farewelled this week by both students and staff. Her support of our students and of the College has been enormous and greatly appreciated. We thank Mrs Hameed for her passion, energy and dedication and wish her all the very best with her future endeavours. It was also very special to have former principal Steve Bovaird join us in farewelling Sofia.

We are delighted to announce that the Board of Trustees has appointed Ms Hannah Arthur as the new Year 12 Dean. Ms Arthur is excited to be working with the Year 12 students and began her new role by welcoming the Year 12 students attending the Ball. 

AUCKLAND REGIONAL HOSPITALITY COMPETITION

Five Hospitality students participated in the Auckland Regional Hospitality competition on 7 July 2021 that was held at MIT, Otara. The students ranged from Year 11 - Year 13 and impressed the judges in their various categories.

In the Café Style Cakes category, Khushi Patel presented a three-layer vanilla cake with salted caramel buttercream, filled with apple sauce, decorated with a caramel drip and topped with a ring of crumble. The Kiwi Classic Biscuits category were represented by Emilia Parker and Sarah Whitefield. Emilia won a silver medal for her entry of Afghan and Anzac biscuits and Sarah was awarded a gold medal and Top of the Class for her category.

MINISTRY OF EDUCATION - TEACHER ONLY DAY

The focus of the Teacher Only Day, Tuesday 10 August, will be the changes to Level 1 from 2023 as part of the NCEA Change Package. The new standards are still in draft stages, and this will be the first opportunity for teachers to look at them in detail.

The changes at Year 11 for 2023 will have implications for the junior school. We are taking this opportunity to review our teaching and learning programmes from Year 9 - 11, to evaluate what our students need to know and do in order to be successful at Level 2 and beyond.

An important part of this review is to understand what success looks like for our parents and whānau. We want to work with our community to design programmes that suit the needs of our students. There will be an Information Evening later in the term, where parents of current Year 9 students will be invited to hear about the NCEA Change Package and what impact it will have on their children (who will be Year 11 in 2023 when the changes are implemented).

NZQA – STUDENT ASSESSMENT GUIDES

The following are reminders from Student Assessment Guides (on Schoology and the school's website).

Meeting a Deadline and Extension Applications

- All work MUST be submitted on or before the due date.
- The deadline will be indicated on the assignment. It is *the student's responsibility* to make sure their work is submitted by the deadline.
- Failure to meet the due date may result in 'Not Achieved'.
- If there are special circumstances that means work cannot be submitted by the due date, an extension <u>can be requested</u> <u>before the due date</u>. A valid reason is needed to be granted an extension. (e.g. medical, bereavement, representing NZ; NOT an overseas holiday). Please note, for practical assessments and experiments, it may not always be possible for an extension to be granted. An Extension Application form is available from the subject Faculty Leader/Head of Department or the Deputy Principal (Ms Harris).

Breach of Assessment Rules

Breaking assessment rules and misconduct during an assessment is taken very seriously. Students are expected to follow written and verbal instructions.

A breach includes:

- Submitting another person's work and pretending it is your own (plagiarism) will not be tolerated. This includes copying another student's work, allowing someone to copy your work or copying from resource material without identifying the source.
- Communicating with someone else in any way during a test or exam.
- Inappropriate use of a mobile phone or device (this includes having the phone on their person and/or not switching them off).
- Taking notes and handouts into an exam.
- Students are expected to follow the assessment instructions this includes written and verbal instructions issued as part of the assessment process.

The course of action if a breach is proven could also include some or all of the following:

A warning.

A result of 'Not Achieved'.

Reported to NZQA.

Resubmitting the work under the HoDs or PN's supervision.

Information being passed on to the HoDs of other option classes.

Work in other parts of the subject re-evaluated.

Work in other subjects re-evaluated.

Staff will monitor the progress of student work to prove authenticity – attendance in class and meeting milestones are particularly important to enable authenticity to be verified. When handing in assessments a student will need to sign the Authenticity Section on the front of the coversheet.

Caleb Young (Y11) competed in the Diving NZ National Championships over the 9-11th July. He had a very successful nationals, winning **Gold** in Boys Age group A Platform, **Silver** on 3m springboard. and he was just 3 points short of taking the NZ Boys A National Title across all boards.

He has now been invited to join the Junior Elite Boys from Term 3, which gives him the opportunity to compete internationally when competitions allow or covid lifts, when he has his list dives across all boards.

Jamie Hall (Y12) has been nominated to represent U18s in New Zealand Climbing.

In the Auckland College Climbing Series Jamie **won** the first round (21st March) and placed 2nd at the Bouldering last term. He has consistently placed 1st - 2nd in climbing competitions for the past 4 years.
