Kia ora koutou

Monday 17 to Friday 21 May was Bullying-Free NZ Week. Our Peer Sexuality Support Students (PSSP) and Safe Schools students have led a range of initiatives this week culminating in today's Pink Shirt Day. Their presentations at assemblies have highlighted the role of empowering students to be part of the solution.

This has aligned well with our value for the term, **Whanaungatanga tika**, and focus on 'we are caring'. Students have been challenged to pause before saying or posting anything and ask themselves 'am I being kind'? As a community we can all do more in 'calling out' unkind behaviour and being part of the solution and not a bystander.

Last weekend there was a hive of activity onsite as we hosted a number of sporting fixtures. The fields are standing up to this heavy use well. It was great seeing so many of our students and families on the sidelines supporting the teams. Being able to claim a 'home game' advantage is only possible with spectator support. Students have been encouraged to support our teams (the draw is posted on Schoology) both at home and away games. Gate 2 will be opened each Saturday by 8.00am for ease of access and parking. During the week the pedestrian gates are unlocked at 7.00am.

Schools are smoke and vape free zones. Signs are posted around the school. We remind all our community (students, staff, whānau and visitors) of this legal requirement.

Mobile Phone Use in Class

To support your child's learning and wellbeing, students are asked to have their phones and headphone away in their bags when they enter a learning space. They will only be allowed to use their phone with the teacher's permission for a specific learning activity. We are hopeful that this will help students to develop healthy habits around phone use and will support Manaakitanga as one of our school values.

Kāhui Ako Conference / Staff Only Day - Friday 4 June

On Friday 4 June, our staff will be engaging in professional learning with the other nine schools in the Lynfield Kāhui Ako. The focus for the day is Culturally Responsive and Relational Pedagogy, and there will be a variety of external and internal experts that our staff will be working with. All teaching staff will be off site on this day, therefore the school will be closed and no student supervision available.

Please note: Opportunities are available for work experience students with Kainga Ora in the July holidays and October holidays with a view to fulltime work, etc.






STUDENT LEADER PROFILE – INTERNATIONAL STUDENT REPRESENTATIVE

LYNFIELD COLLEGE STUDENTS REPRESENT NEW ZEALAND IN INTERNATIONAL PASCH PROJECTS

Teesha Sharma and Sarka Ludvigova (Year 12) represented New Zealand in the Digi-Vision project for PASCH students from Southeast Asia, Australia and New Zealand. They developed skills in photography and video in an international seminar conducted in the German language, and also participated in dareCon! a conference for young people from around the world exploring their vision for the future. The Digi-Vision project ended with an international zoom meeting showcasing students' projects in short films and trailers. Teesha and Sarka both received a camera for their contribution to the Digi-Vision project.

Keagan Menezes (Year 11) was one of three other students from New Zealand who also attended the digital dareCon! Students learned how Artificial Intelligence was developed, how it works and how humans plan to use it in the future. They were also introduced to AI based games, one including 'quickdraw', where students had to draw pictures and see whether or not AI could recognise what they had drawn. Students discussed with others as to what our future may look like and how we shape it.





















WHATABOUTME.NZ - THE NATIONAL YOUTH HEALTH AND WELLBEING SURVEY

Our school has been selected to take part in whataboutme.nz, a nationwide survey of young people in Aotearoa/New Zealand. The survey will provide important information about what it is like to be a young person in Aotearoa. The results from our school and 150 others around the country will inform future government youth health and wellbeing policy.

One class in each year group will be randomly selected to complete the survey during school time with a researcher and youth worker. Whataboutme.nz is completely anonymous and young people will not be asked to give their names or other identifying information. The survey is not compulsory and students do not have to take part.

We will send whānau and students from participating classes information sheets with more details. We encourage you to discuss participation in the survey to help your student decide whether or not to participate.

The information sheet has instructions for opting out. Students from our school will be completing the survey on Thursday 27 May 2021.


