# Senior Assessment Weeks 12 - 23 September

# Literacy Numeracy Pilot Year 10

The second round of the Year 10 Literacy Numeracy Pilot assessments will be in Week 9. Students who are sitting these assessments are working with their Maths teachers to ensure they are registered on NZQA and have a log in.

The dates are as follows:

Tuesday 20 September Reading

Wednesday 21 September | Numeracy

Thursday 22 September | Writing

All assessments start at 9.00am in the Hall and are completed digitally. Students will need to ensure their devices are fully charged on the day and they remember their password to log in.

A letter has been emailed to parents of those students who sit at least 1 exam. It is generic, but on Monday Week 9 students will all be given a slip to say what papers they do and the day and time. **Students who did not achieve in June have an opportunity to resit.** 

# Change to NCEA Credits for 2022

Due to the impact of COVID-19 in 2022, students will be entitled to **1 Learning Recognition Credit (LRC) for every 5 credits** earned through assessment, up to a maximum of:

# NCEA Level 1 - 10 LRC | NCEA Level 2 - 8 LRC | NCEA Level 3 - 8 LRC

To receive a Certificate Endorsement, students will need 46 credits at Merit or Excellence level, instead of the usual 50.

To be awarded University Entrance, students will need **14 credits in each of two UE Approved Subjects, and 12 credits in a third UE Approved Subject** (they will also need to attain NCEA Level 3 and meet the regular literacy and numeracy requirements).

The submission dates for some externally assessed portfolios have also been moved back one week.

# Skittles Group Presentation and Personal Safety Education Workshop

On 31 August, our Skittles Group had an opportunity presented to the staff as part of the teachers' professional development programme. The presentation focused on two key areas, the difference between gender and sex, including an explanation of takatāpui and fa'afafine / fa'afatama; and some concerns LGBTQIA+ students have at school and how teachers can best support them. There was a Q and A session, and teachers asked some very thoughtful and varied questions. The presentation finished off with a lively team Kahoot to check staff understanding. It was a closely fought match to see which faculties were had the best knowledge of the topic and decide who would get the boxes of Skittles prizes. 1st place went to a group fr0m the English Dept, the Teacher Trainees managed to hold 2nd place and close behind in 3rd place was the PE Dept. Thanks to our very entertaining Skittles leaders who once again



showed leadership and courage in their presentation, to all the members of Skittles who did the research and prepared the slides, and to members of the Skittles for on the day and being involved on the day.

The morning presentation was followed by 15 students participating in a Personal Safety Education Workshop run by Kia Haumaru.

Applications for the Lynfield College Gateway Programme for 2023 are now open. This is a great opportunity for students to explore future study and career pathways. Requirements:

Be able to study at a NCEA Level 2 and 3
Have a couple of career options students want to explore
Display good skills that are required in the workplace (employability skills)
Started studying towards a Learner Licence
Complete a Gateway application and interview

If accepted, students will most likely be out of school for one day per week for somewhere between 2-5 weeks. They may also need to attend a course (usually for 1 week), during the school holidays. 














#### **SUMMER SPORT**
