
### ***Community Outreach Christmas Cakes***

## Oceania Experience

The Oceania Experience during Project Week started with an emphasis on Tonga. One of the ingredients for Otai is apples which students cut and grated. This traditional drink proved so popular that a number of students took the recipe to replicate at a later date for their families. On this day, leis were made using fresh flowers brought from a staff member's gardens and traditional patterns were replicated in art. Thanks go to Seini Moala for sharing her expertise with teachers and students.

The second day of the Oceania Experience was devoted to Samoa. Authenticity was brought to the cooking of Koko Alaisa by using real koko (brought from Samoa by Poto's parents) and coconuts. Poto was able to demonstrate expert slicing and grating techniques. Other activities included the making of flowers and weaving flax to make small mats. Participants found all activities engrossing.



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## **BOLD Sailing**

A group of 20 Year 10 students opted in to participate in the BOLD sailing experiences. It was a pilot programme delivered with MERC (Sir Peter Blake Marine Education and Recreation Centre) and the NZST (New Zealand Sailing Trust).

During our sailing adventure, we went on two thrilling day trips on the 13<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup> of November. The first day was an enriching experience with MERC. We spent the day aboard small sail boats learning how to tack, steer, navigate, work as a team, and successfully manoeuvre a sailboat. We also experienced capsizing. The next sailing day our expedition was with the NZST aboard *Steinlager II* and, guided by a professional team, we navigated around Rangitoto, Motutapu and Motuihe Islands. We learnt how to utilize grinders, adjust sails and master more advanced techniques as well as steer. We ate lunch while aboard which added to the allure of the day. Both experiences were phenomenal, providing not only valuable information but also unforgettable memories. ## China Student Exchange Hosting 2024

For the past 12 years, Lynfield College has had an exchange programme with Greentown School, a sister school in Hangzhou, China. After an interrupted 3 years, we are delighted that we are now in a position to resume this exchange programme, and are planning to visit Hangzhou in April 2025.

Our Lynfield College students will travel around Hangzhou, Shanghai and Beijing for 10 days. This includes a visit to Greentown School to carry on our exchange programme. The exact itinerary and cost is still to be finalised but the students will experience all the cultural, social and academic benefits such exchanges are known for. We are excited to again be able to offer such benefits to our students, families, school and community.

Next year, a group of students from Greentown school will visit New Zealand in February 2024. They are going to travel around New Zealand for 7 days and visit Lynfield College for 3 days. They are going to arrive at Lynfield College on Sunday afternoon 3pm, 18 February 2024, and will leave our school on Wednesday afternoon (3 nights and 3 days).

We are seeking families who are interested in hosting a Chinese student during their Lynfield College visit next year. Due the popularity of these trips, those that host an exchange student will be given priority to taking part in the 2025 China trip.

The exchange programme is based on a reciprocal concept. Visiting students become part of the family. No payment is made for hosting a Chinese student here and no payment is required when one of our students is hosted by a family in China for 4 days.

Please let us know as soon as possible if you are interested in hosting a Chinese student for 3 nights and 3 days from 18<sup>th</sup> February (Sunday afternoon) to 21<sup>st</sup> February (Wednesday afternoon).
