#### Parent - Student - Teacher conferences

#### PPTA Strike action

We have been advised that due to ongoing industrial action by the teachers union PPTA, after negotiations with the Ministry of Education failed, a second PPTA Strike Day may be called for Wednesday 29 March. Official notification of this is expected to be sent to schools on Sunday 26 March. We will update you further once this has been received, so do keep an eye out for this. Should the strike proceed, supervision, by non-union teachers, will be available for students under 14 years.

## Looking forward to Cultural Festival Day 1 April

Students, staff and whānau are demonstrating whanaungatanga tika - we are collaborative, as they work together to prepare for our Cultural Festival Day celebrations on Saturday 1 April. We are delighted to be able to welcome our extended community back onsite to join us for these.

# Literacy and Numeracy Standards for Year 10 Parents and Caregivers

The NCEA Literacy and Numeracy standards will become compulsory next year in 2024. This year, we are able to offer some Year 10 students the opportunity to obtain Literacy and Numeracy standards in Term 2, before it becomes mandatory. Decisions about who attempts each standard will be made on individual readiness, based on curriculum levels. If students pass this year, they do not need to sit the standards in Year 11.

All other students will be offered the standards two times, next year in Year 11 and similarly again in Year 12 if needed. All teachers, across subjects, will be providing tips and guidance to students, to help them hone the skills necessary to pass. ## **GATEWAY Programme**

There are still spaces in the Gateway Programme for students. This is an "alongside school" programme designed to give students the opportunity to explore future careers. Students participate in 2- to 5-day work placements in an industry of their choice, so that they can make informed decisions about what they want to do when they move on from school. Being in a workplace gives students the chance to talk with people in the industry and find out about qualifications. Post-school options include tertiary training (including apprenticeships, cadetships, private training organisations, polytechnics and universities). Students must be "work-ready" (evidence employability skills) and be able to study at NCEA Level 2 and 3. Placements available – trade industries and hospitality industries.


#### **SEA DWELLER**

By Ayaan Vasudeva


I remember the time,


