### **Industrial Action - update**

We have been advised that today's facilitated bargaining between PPTA and Ministry of Education negotiators has broken down. This means that rostering home will continue as advised (email sent 9 June) and schools will close early on Tuesday 27 June for a Paid Union Meeting. Thank you to those who have expressed their concerns about the teacher shortage.

### **Decision making**

In the previous NewsLink I commented on decision making, particularly with regard to following our school rules. This was in support of students being able to use our bathroom facilities for their intended purpose. It appears that bathroom facilities are also being mis-used in the community with LynnMall contacting local schools to make students and parents aware that inappropriate behaviour normally warrants a written trespass from the Centre. This is a legal document, valid for 2 years. Any trespass breaches during that time can lead to an arrest by the NZ Police. They would prefer not to have to go down that route.

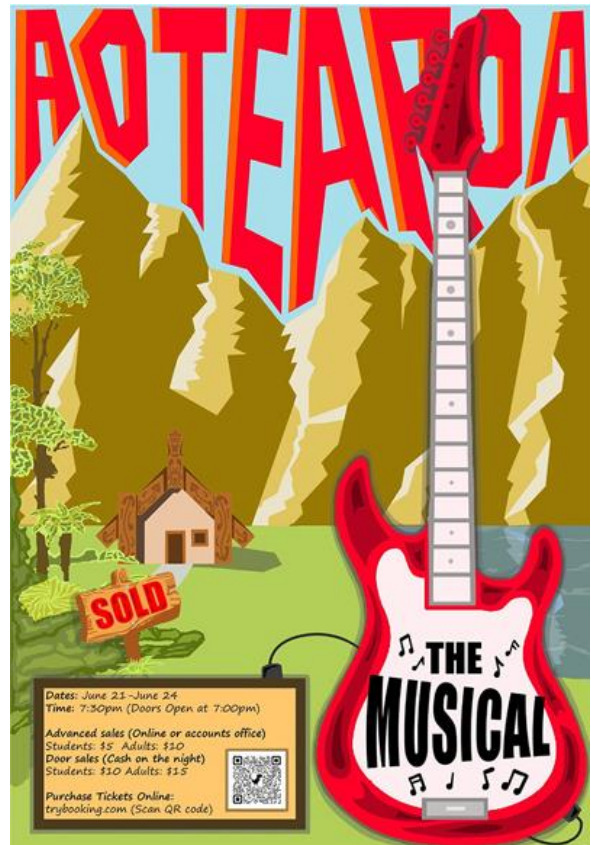
