POTAUAINA, Linda



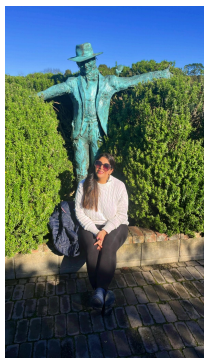
