Assessment / Exam Weeks

Weeks 8 and 9 were an extremely busy time for our Year 12 and 13 students as they sat derived grade practice exams or attended practical assessment workshops. Practice exams give students an opportunity to identify gaps in their learning before the external NCEA exams November. Most students were well organised and prepared. However, this is a timely reminder that students need to arrive 10-15 minutes before an exam begins, ensure they have all the equipment they require (including a charged laptop if sitting a digital exam) and follow the instructions given by supervisors. NZQA have very strict rules around exams and students can potentially lose grades if they are caught breaching assessment rules.



Note: A derived grade is only provisional and can only be applied for should a student have a valid reason. The final decision is one NZQA makes and is only confirmed in January when results are released.

1st XI Girls Hockey 18th in Mary Clinton tournament (21 teams competed in Whangarei)








NZSS INDIVIDUAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

LYNFIELD COLLEGE BLAZER

The Lynfield College blazer is available to all students. The cost is \$260 and it can be purchased from the Uniform Shop. We only have a few available in each size at the moment, but if we have high demand, more stock can be brought in.

ONLINE ORDERING

Online ordering is available through our website https://lynfield.school.nz/shop.html. Payment can be made by direct credit or credit card and students onsite are able to collect the items from the shop during the above times. Orders are usually ready the next day.
