Lynfield Robotics Team - World Championships


A BIG THANK YOU TO THE SPONSORS OF LYNFIELD COLLEGE ROBOTICS

MEASLES

Measles is a very contagious viral illness that spreads easily between people and makes most people feel very unwell. It can also cause serious health problems.

We are starting to see more measles in Aotearoa. Please check the link below to see if you were at any of the locations of interest on the same days and at the same times mentioned, and follow the relevant advice for close or casual contacts.

The measles vaccine is very effective at preventing measles.

The measles (MMR) vaccine is free for all children under 18 years in New Zealand, and all adults over the age of 18 who are eligible for free NZ healthcare.





Lynfield College Teacher Aides

There are 18 teacher aides in Lynfield's Learning Support Department, four of whom are male. One of the positions is a job share. Their ethnic range reflects that of the school – Indian, Samoan, Tongan, Afghan, Pakistani, Irish, English and home-grown Kiwis – some with roots in Croatia & Quebec in Canada. Over half have university degrees but the most essential qualifications these people display are initiative, empathy, well-honed powers of observation, problem solving skills and dedication to helping students achieve their goals. A sense of humour is essential in their job and this trait is present in all of them. Their tasks range from personal care through to helping students in Yrs 9-13 in all curriculum areas. They also act as reader writers when necessary for students who require Special Assessment Conditions. Their hours of work are from 8.30 am to 3.20pm (paid term time only). The work they do keeps this school of 2000 students and 180 staff going and we are grateful to them. We are currently advertising for more teacher aides and, in the past we have rreceived many applications from dedicated people who want to make a difference. This week is **Support Staff Appreciation Week** so we, at Lynfield, want all our support staff to know how highly they are valued.
