Touring Our Own Backyard - Tourism Trip 2025

On the 30th July, students from 2TOU and 3TOU went on an unforgettable trip packed with lots of fun and challenges. They kicked things off with an exciting game of mini golf at Treasure Island Adventure Golf, just opposite of Auckland Domestic Airport. They excelled in this and some even managed to get some "Holes In One". Students then strolled off to visit the New Zealand School of Tourism where they got the opportunity to see what it would be like if they chose to study in the Tourism Industry. At the Tourism school, a highlight for the students was getting the chance to step inside a real aircraft used for training. From exploring the cockpit, to getting to sit in economy class of the aeroplane, it was a one of a kind experience that blended fun with future career insights. Mathematics Mentoring Programme

The Maths tutoring programme is a new initiative at Lynfield College and holds a lot of promise. Selected Year 13 students have offered to do maths tutoring for our Year 9 students who need support. This is an early intervention initiative to support students to achieve success in Maths and become more confident. Based on their eAsTTle scores and topic results, about 90 Year 9 students have been identified and matched up with a Year 13 student of similar culture/ethinicity/language and gender. They meet once a week - Day 3 (Wednesday in F Block) and Day 6 (Monday C Block) during Huimai time. This pilot programme is being run through Term 3 until the Year 13 students have study leave in Week 7.







Year 13 Māori and Pacific Students Shine at AUT Aspire Day

On Friday 18 July, a group of our Year 13 Māori and Pacific students attended AUT's Aspire Day 2025 — an event designed to uplift and empower students as they prepare for life after high school. Students engaged in hands-on workshops focused on goal setting, self-reflection, and future planning, while also gaining valuable insights from AUT students, alumni, and industry professionals who shared how their cultural identity has shaped their journeys. Please be aware that we do not have the full size range in the second hand items. Proceeds from secondhand uniform sales go to our hardship fund to support students in need.

LYNFIELD COLLEGE BLAZER

The Lynfield College blazer is available to all students. The cost is \$260 and it can be purchased from the Uniform Shop. We only have a few available in each size at the moment, but if we have high demand, more stock can be brought in.

ONLINE ORDERING

VECTOR – SCHEDULED OVERHEAD MAINTENANCE WORK INVOLVING POLE REPLACEMENTS


Roads affected: White Swan Road, Mt Roskill
