NCEA exams

These start on Tuesday 4 November with Level 2 Mathematics and Statistics, Level 3 Dance and Scholarship Classical Studies. Those sitting external exams should have already collected their entry slip from the school. Please check through the exam timetable with your child (https://www2.nzqa.govt.nz/assets/NCEA/2025-Exam-Timetable.pdf) so you know when they need to be at school. We are looking to avoid anyone turning up in the afternoon for an exam that had already been held in the morning this year!

Measles and NCEA exams

With the number of positive cases of measles increasing, schools are checking to see that their immunisation registers are as up to date as possible. If we haven't already received MMR / immunisation records for your child you can expect an email from us looking for any updated information.

Schools have been contacted by NZQA this week about the possible impacts of measles during the NCEA and NZ Scholarship examination period. If a student is not permitted to attend an exam because they may have measles, the decision will be made by HealthNZ Te Whatu Ora in conjunction with the school. Evidence that the student was not able to attend the exam must be provided for the student to be eligible for a derived grade. Note: Derived Grades are not available for NZ Scholarship exams.

All students are expected to sit their exams unless they have been specifically told not to attend by Health NZ or by the school. Choosing to stay home voluntarily (for example, to avoid potential exposure) is not grounds for a Derived Grade.

At the beginning of this term, Lynfield College welcomed 21 German exchange students from Werder for a 16-day adventure of learning, culture, and friendship. From joining classes and sports to exploring Aotearoa, our visitors embraced every moment of Kiwi life.

Their North Island journey included the Waitangi Treaty Grounds, Rotorua geothermal wonders and Māori culture, a hike to Taranaki Falls, and the magical Waitomo Caves. At school, the students joined our German classes for fun cultural exchanges—such as handball matches, a Kiwi slang and te reo Māori quiz, blindfolded food tasting (yes, even Marmite!), touch rugby and exploring NZ/Māori literacy. Highlights also included homemade pavlova, Anzac biscuits, and workshops at the Auckland Museum exploring Te Hekenga Nui and Mana.

Weekends with host families offered chances to discover Auckland's beaches, volcanoes, and native bush. The exchange created deep connections, new friendships, and a shared appreciation of language, hospitality, and cultural identity. A reminder that for all digital exams students need to ensure they have a laptop and that it holds its charge for the duration of the exam. They should know their password and log into NZQA prior to the exam.

Derived Grades: Where a student faces extenuating circumstances and is not able to sit their NCEA external examinations, a derived grade can be applied for using this link **Download a derived grade application form [PDF, 121 KB]** or collect an application form from the school office. Students need to provide supporting documents that show why, for circumstances beyond their control, they couldn't attend an external examination or submitted an incomplete externally assessed portfolio. Derived grade applications are due no more than 2 weeks after the student's last affected exam or assessment. All Derived Grades are only provisional. They are confirmed by NZQA in January when results are released.

The Lynfield College blazer is available to all students. The cost is \$260 and it can be purchased from the Uniform Shop. We only have a few available in each size at the moment, but if we have high demand, more stock can be brought in.

ONLINE ORDERING
