Update on Industrial Action

FROM LYNFIELD TO LAGER: ALUMNI BREWING UP SUCCESS

Two Lynfield College alumni, Craig Hebblethwaite and Matt Holden, are making waves in the craft beer industry as the proud owners and operators of Black Sands Brewing – New Zealand's only brewery run by Generation Z.

Black Sands was originally founded in 2013 by their fathers, Ian Hebblethwaite and David Holden, who turned their passion for home brewing into a thriving local business. Craig joined the team in 2022 and soon took over the running of the brewery, allowing his dad to take a step back. Then in 2023, Matt joined to contribute his remarkable technical brewing expertise – and the pair have been crafting success ever since.

Craig attended Lynfield College from 2010 to 2014, where he was actively involved in music and was Arts and Culture Captain in 2014. After graduating, he studied Law and Commerce at the University of Auckland and worked at Deloitte, before realising that his true passion lay in brewing – something that had always been part of his family's story. He left his job at Deloitte, joined Black Sands and hasn't looked back since. Craig still speaks fondly of his time at Lynfield and stays in touch with many of his school friends today.

Matt, who attended Lynfield from 2015 to 2018, followed his creative drive into Audio Engineering at the SAE Creative Media Institute in Parnell. He continues to work in the audio industry from time to time, but brewing has become his main focus. After spending time overseas perfecting his craft, Matt graduated from the Institute of Brewing in the UK and has since become the youngest award-winning brewer in New Zealand's history — an incredible achievement.

Together, Craig and Matt are building on their fathers' legacy while bringing a fresh, youthful energy to the business. Their Black Sands Pilsner recently featured in the New World Top 25 Beers and Ciders Awards, showcasing the quality of their work.




HETTASNZ Awards

Words like *Tor* (goal), *links* (left), *rechts* (right), *fangen* (catch), *werfen* (throw), and *Mitte* (center) became part of their active learning as they practiced drills and techniques.

During the session, students explored basic handball rules, learned interesting facts about the game, and then applied their skills in a fun, energetic match. Students were enthusiastic, motivated, and fully involved from start to finish, showing that learning a language can be active and fun.

NCEA Exams

NCEA exams began on November 4 and have been going very smoothly. Well done students for being well organised with your admission slips, punctual for your exams and for carefully following instructions from NZQA supervisors. Exams finish on November 28. Study rooms (F9 and 10) are available for students to work in if they need a quiet space.

Workshops

Teachers are continuing to run workshops for Year 12 and 13 students to complete internal standards. These are by arrangement with the subject teacher.

Summer School (Te Kura)

Summer School is a short-term, online learning programme for eligible ākonga (students) who need up to 12 NCEA credits to move into further study, training, or employment.


Note: Students will be responsible for managing their own learning. Subject teachers will be available to provide guidance and feedback on course material only. To succeed, students need to be motivated, organised, and committed to working independently.

Enrolment open on 24 November. Summer School starts 16 Dec. Enrolment closes at midday 23 January. A range of NCEA Level 2 and Level 3 subjects are offered. Students can enrol in up to 12 credits the credit limit drops to 6 credits from 12 January.
